

## ABOUT THE NCAA DIVISION III

Texas Lutheran began a three-year transition from NCAA Division II and the NAIA to the NCAA Division III in 1999. Texas Lutheran became a full member of the NCAA Division III for the 2002-03 academic year. During its entire membership in the NCAA Division III, Texas Lutheran has been a member of the all-DIII American Southwest Conference.

Colleges and universities in NCAA Division III place highest priority on the overall quality of the educational experience and on the successful completion of all academic programs. They seek to establish and maintain an environment in which a student-athlete's athletic activities are conducted as an integral part of the student-athlete's educational experience. They also seek to establish and maintain an environment that values cultural diversity and gender equity among their student-athletes and athletics staff.

ASC members believe team and individual sports provide learning opportunities, and its membership strives to create an athletics environment supportive of teaching and learning. # TLU picked sixth in 2008 Preseason Football Poll

The Texas Lutheran Bulldogs were picked sixth in the 2008 American Southwest Conference Preseason Football Poll, released this week after a vote by the league's head coaches, sports information directors and selected media members.

The Bulldogs, coming off a 2007 campaign that produced a 2-8 overall record and a 2-6 ASC mark, were picked behind ASC favorite Mary Hardin-Baylor and conference members Hardin-Simmons, Mississippi College, East Texas Baptist and Louisiana College.

TLU placed ahead of Howard Payne, Sul Ross State and McMurry in the poll.

The University of Mary Hardin-Baylor was picked to win its fourth straight ASC football title. Earning preseason player of the year honors were Mississippi College's Adam Shaffer, UMHB's Eric Henri and East Texas Baptist University's Kyle Pope.

Mary Hardin-Baylor, which went 12-2 overall (8-0 in ASC) and reached the national semifinals of the NCAA Division III playoffs last season, totaled 240 points – the highest amount in the annual poll's history – and collected 24 of the possible 27 first-place votes. Head Coach Pete Fredenburg's Cru has won at least a share of the ASC title in five of the last six seasons, going 48-3 over that time frame in conference games. UMHB also holds a 21-game winning streak against league opponents.

Hardin-Simmons University and Mississippi College, which tied for second place last season with 6-2 league marks, were picked to finish second and third, respectively, by just one point. HSU totaled 197 points and garnered one first-place vote, while MC had 196 points and the final two top-spot votes.

East Texas Baptist (154 pts.), which had a 5-3 ASC record last season, was picked to finish fourth. Louisiana College (125 pts.) was selected in the fifth spot, followed by TLU (97 pts.), Howard Payne (85 pts.), Sul Ross State (61 pts.) and McMurry (60 pts.).

TLU will hit the field on Sept. 6 with a non-conference road game in Alpine, Texas against Sul Ross State. The game starts the second year for the Bulldogs under Head Coach Dennis Parker.

The Bulldogs return 50 lettermen from the 2007 squad. Among the returnees are junior running back Anthony Smith (Bay City/Bay City) and senior defensive back Dwight Bonner, who were each named to the ASC All-Conference Team last season.

Smith was a Second Team All-ASC choice and was named the TLU David Wehmeyer Most Valuable Offensive Player (non-lineman award), the TLU Mike Washington Most Valuable Offensive Player and the TLU Jim Wacker Most Valuable Player.

Smith rushed for a TLU NCAA Division III-era record 1,066 yards and scored a team-best 66 points. He scored six rushing TDs, four receiving TDs and had a 92-yard kickoff return for a touchdown on the opening kickoff of the 2007 season. Smith led the ASC in all purpose yards (a school-record 1,989) and finished fifth in NCAA Division III in all-purpose yards per game (198.9).

Bonner, a First Team All-ASC selection in 2007, was second on the team in tackles, with 69, and second in the conference for tackles among defensive backs. Bonner had 5.5 tackles for loss for nine yards. He also intercepted three passes for 56 yards and had eight pass break-ups. Bonner scored on a blocked punt in the three-overtime road loss to Sul Ross State. Bonner's three interceptions brought his career total to 12.

TLU will also welcome back fifth-year quarterback Joel Waldon, who missed nearly all of the 2007 season after a knee-injury in the season-opener. Waldon received a medical redshirt and enters the 2008 preseason camp as the team's starting quarterback.

The 2008 ASC season – the 13th in league history – opens Sept. 6, with seven league members in action (East Texas Baptist, Hardin-Simmons, McMurry, Mississippi College, Sul Ross State and Texas Lutheran). Howard Payne and Mary Hardin-Baylor begin their slates on Sept. 13.

The NCAA Division III Football Championship playoffs are scheduled for a Nov. 22 start, with the Amos Alonzo Stagg Bowl championship game on tap for Dec. 20.

## FOCUS ON THE LOBOS

### Schroeder Takes Over

Wayne Schroeder was named 16th head football coach at Sul Ross State University in February of 2008. Schroeder, who spent the past 2 seasons as defensive line coach for the Lobo football team, replaces Steve Wright, who stepped down from the head coach's position in December 2007. Schroeder helped guide the Lobos to a 10-9 record including an American Southwest Conference mark of 8-9.

Schroeder takes the head coach's job with a coaching career that spans more than 35 years. A 1969 graduate of Southwest Texas State University-San Marcos (kinesiology), Schroeder served as athletic coordinator and head football coach at William B. Travis High School in Austin from 2001-06, where he led the team to a bi-district appearance in 2004.

Prior to his run in Austin, Schroeder served as director of athletics and head football coach at Taylor High School from 1987-2000, leading the team to eight playoff showings. Schroeder was also head football and boys basketball coach at Granger High School (1972-74). He began his coaching career as head football and basketball coach at Hutto High from 1969-71.

"I can't express the gratitude I have for Sul Ross allowing me this tremendous opportunity," Schroeder said. "To be able to walk into a program that Coach Wright has taken to a competitive level and continue to improve on that foundation brings many exciting challenges and I know that we are looking forward to meeting those challenges."

"With continual improvement not just on the field but in the recruiting and retention aspects, we will continue to solidify a growing loyalty between our football program and the Alpine community." squads."

### Fanara Era Begins

Steve Fanara takes over as head coach for the Howard Payne Yellow Jackets after serving the past three seasons as the defensive coordinator at HPU. Fanara first took over the HPU defense in 2005 and improved the Yellow Jackets significantly in several conference categories including: total defense, rushing defense, scoring defense and pass efficiency defense. The Yellow Jackets finished 2nd in the ASC in rushing defense improving from 205 yards per game in 2004 to allowing just 110 yards per game in 2005. McMurry, coming off a 2-8 overall showing and 1-7 mark in ASC play last year, was picked to finish ninth in the preseason poll after the school only accrued 60 points in the poll, which was one less point than Sul Ross State's (eighth place) 61 points. But second-year head coach Donny Gray didn't put much stock into the pre-season tally.

"I'm not too upset about (the ASC preseason football poll)," Gray said. "No games have ever been won by a poll. The most misunderstood thing about preseason polls is that they don't describe this year's team. The polls are based on history and not the present team."

"Our kids this year are unproven, but that's okay," Gray continued. "That's why we play the season."

Gray and McMurry return five starters on offense (three on the offensive line) and eight starters on defense, including the top four returning tacklers from 2007.

### Breaking Ground

Louisiana College broke ground on a new football stadium in late July. And if all goes well, the Wildcats could play some of its final 2008 games at the new location. Whether the Wildcats get to the new stadium this year or not, Pineville High School's Bates Stadium will see its final year of use by LC in 2008.

The stadium project totals approximately \$8 million and will be completed in three phases:

Phase one – A new turf field and stadium seating for 7,000 will be installed. The first phase is scheduled to be completed in time for the 2008 Homecoming game against Howard Payne University on October 25.

Phase two – Completion of a brick façade surrounding the bleachers. This area will include concession areas, home-side and visitor restrooms, and a press box, press suite and donor suite that will be accessible by elevator.

Phase three – Completion of a three-story athletic/academic building that will house the athletic training program including classrooms, offices, locker rooms, weight and training facilities and meeting rooms.

### Shaffer Knows Best

Adam Shaffer, Mississippi College's is the ASC Preseason Offensive Player of the Year after a vote by the ASC's coaches, sports information directors and media members. Shaffer was a First Team All-ASC selection as a sophomore in 2007.

In two seasons plus one half of play, Shaffer has thrown for 5,966 yards and 56 touchdowns. In 2007, returning from the knee injury, he surpassed the 300-yard mark six times, the 400-yard mark four times and the 450-yard mark three times.

Shaffer won't have the services of NFL free-agent signee Jake Allen, but Shaffer will have no shortage of offensive weapons at his disposal. Junior tailback Chris Blanton is one of the fastest backs in the conference and comes off a year in which he scored 11 touchdowns and averaged 5.2 yards per carry.

Shaffer will also have three outstanding linemen – offensive tackles C.J. Herring and Josh Lankford and offensive guard Nelson Craddock – to open running lanes and keep defensive players out of the QB's way.
