Dennis Parker is in his third year as head coach for the Texas Lutheran Bulldogs. Parker returned to his Texas coaching roots in 2007 after coaching in Mesa, Ariz., at Mesa High School, for three seasons.

Parker led TLU to a two-win improvement in 2008. TLU went 4-6 last season after opening with a 2-8 campaign in 2007, Parker's first year with the program. Parker was hired on Jan. 22, 2007 as the 22<sup>nd</sup> coach in school history.

ETBU head coach Mark Sartain has guided the Tigers through a rebuilding process the last two seasons, with back-to-back 5-5 finishes that resulted in ETBU hovering in the upper half of the American Southwest Conference standings.

Under Sartain's guidance the last two seasons the Tigers have shown marked improvement both on the field and in the classroom, with a record 17 Tiger student-athletes being named ASC All-Academic in 2008.

Sartain was named ETBU's second head football coach in the modern era of the program on Dec. 13, 2006, and has stressed a commitment to recruiting that has resulted in solid classes in his first two seasons at ETBU.

### Game Overview

Texas Lutheran tries to stop the Marshall jinx Saturday at Ornelas Stadium when the Bulldogs play under the lights against East Texas Baptist. The game will be the first night game for the Tigers at Ornelas Stadium.

Kickoff is set for 7 p.m. Pre-game coverage on Seguin radio station KWED 1580 AM will start at 6:30 p.m. Live video (with audio provided by KWED) will be available on the TLU Athletics website ([www.tlu.edu/athletics](http://www.tlu.edu/athletics)). Live stats will be provided by East Texas Baptist, with a link to the live stats available at [www.tlu.edu/athletics](http://www.tlu.edu/athletics).

The Bulldogs are 0-5 all-time in Marshall against East Texas Baptist and 0-4 at Ornelas Stadium. TLU last played at Ornelas Stadium in 2007, Dennis Parker's first season at TLU, and dropped a 19-17 decision.

TLU has lost the last two games at Ornelas by a combined three points. The Bulldogs fell 17-16 in 2005 on a last-second field goal.

ETBU leads the all-time series with TLU by a count of 7-3. The Tigers have won the last two and six of the last eight. In the DIII era for both teams, ETBU holds a 6-3 edge over the Bulldogs.

The Tigers are looking for a 2-0 start in the ASC after opening conference play last week with a 33-20 win at Sul Ross State.

The Bulldogs need to bounce back from last week's 59-7 loss to No. 3-ranked Mary Hardin-Baylor. TLU trailed 45-0 at the half.

### **Bulldogs At A Glance**

Last Saturday was a tough day at the football field for the Bulldogs against No. 3-ranked Mary Hardin-Baylor. UMHB rolled up 614 yards of total offense and moved its American Southwest Conference win streak to 30 games with a 59-7 victory last Saturday night over Texas Lutheran.

At Seguin's Matador Stadium, UMHB (2-0, 1-0 ASC) led 45-0 at the half and 59-0 until the final play of the game. TLU dropped to 0-2 overall and to 0-1 in the ASC.

Against the Bulldogs, the Cru rushed for 354 yards on 42 carries, averaging 8.4 yards per carry. The Cru also excelled through the air, throwing for 260 yards and completing 21 of 23 passes.

UMHB running back Quincy Daniels went over the 100-yard mark with only five carries. He finished with 110 yards and a 66-yard TD. UMHB back-up QB LiDarral Bailey added five rushes for 91 yards with a 58-yard score. Bailey also was 10-for-11 passing with 142 yards and a 54-yard TD pass to Brian Scott. Starting QB Kyle Noack was 11-for-12 with 118 yards and a TD pass.

Against UMHB, TLU was held to 228 yards of total offense. The Bulldogs rushed for 71 yards and threw for 157. Bulldog Quinten Cleveland (Galveston/Ball) rushed 12 times for 50 yards.

Last year, the Bulldogs went 3-0 in league play against the bottom three teams in the conference – Sul Ross State, McMurry and Howard Payne – but went 0-5 against the better teams in the league – with losses to ASC Champion Mary Hardin-Baylor, runner-up Hardin-Simmons, Mississippi College, East Texas Baptist and Louisiana College.

In TLU's three 2008 conference wins over McMurry, Howard Payne and Sul Ross State, TLU out-scored its opponents 70-35.

In the five league losses in 2008, the Bulldogs were out-scored 222-41. In four of those five losses, TLU failed to score more than one touchdown. And in three of those losses, opponents went over the 50-point mark.

With experience returning at just about every position on the field, the Tigers feel like their impact on the conference race will simply come down to how well ETBU plays every Saturday. The personnel is in place to make a run at the title, but showing it on the field is something that still must be proven.

"I believe in 2007 we overachieved, but in 2008 we underachieved," said Sartain, who is 11-12 as coach of the Tigers entering Saturday's game with TLU. "We enter this season with a large number of seniors, returning starters, as well as senior starters. We have proven talent at virtually every position and confidence in those who may be yet unproven. We have established a continuity in our staff and the general priorities of our program and I believe have placed ourselves in a position to compete for our conference championship."

Nine starters are back on defense, including the ASC's Preseason Defensive Player of the Year in senior defensive end Austin Sturrock (6-3, 230/Sour Lake, TX). Eight are back on offense, including all-conference running backs Corey George (5-10, 245/Bossier City, LA) and Jair Stover (5-10, 185/Katy, TX). And kicker Kyle Pope (5-10 190/Longview, TX) remains one of the top specialists in the ASC.

But having the experience and talent to win doesn't necessarily translate into victories, especially in a league where two teams (Mary Hardin-Baylor and Hardin-Simmons) opened the season ranked in the top five in the nation and another two teams (Mississippi College and Louisiana College) have each experienced at least seven-win seasons in the last two years.

"I think without a question the ASC is arguably the toughest Div. III conference, top to bottom, in the nation," said Sartain. "I would take the top five teams in the ASC against the top five teams in any other conference in America, and believe that year in, year out, we could average four wins. You don't win our league by accident. You must be a really good football team, and we believe we have the pieces in place to close in on and overtake the top teams in our conference."

### **When the Bulldogs Have The Ball**

#### **TLU Offense**

The Bulldogs are scheduled to go with junior transfer Jarret Buchholtz (Luling/Luling/Texas College) at quarterback for a second consecutive week. After missing the first game of the year with an injury, Buchholtz started last week against UMHB. Buchholtz completed 11-of-24 passes and was intercepted twice. He threw a 43-yard TD pass to senior wide receiver Jonathon Randle (Prairie View/Waller) on the final play of regulation against UMHB.

Freshman quarterback Rocky Huff (Houston/Jersey Village) started the season-opener vs. Trinity and played sparingly last week against UMHB. Huff was 0-for-2 passing and had an interception returned 61 yards for a Cru score.

Buchholtz and Huff were sacked a total of four times combined. Buchholtz was sacked three of the four times.

Randle was the top target for Buchholtz last Saturday. The senior grabbed four passes for 77 yards. Steven Thrash (Hubbard/Hubbard) added three grabs for 34 yards. Vernon Hughes (Jackson, Miss./Hill/Texas A&M-Kingsville) added two receptions for 51 yards, with a long of 35.

The rushing attack could not get on track last week against UMHB. TLU rushed 35 times for 71 yards, an average of two yards per carry. TLU's leading rusher was junior Quinnten Cleveland (Galveston/Ball), who carried the ball a team-high 12 times for a team-best 50 yards. He had a long run of 16. James Moore (Houston/Elkins) added seven carries for 17 yards.

TLU's leading rusher for the past two seasons, senior Anthony Smith (Bay City/Bay City/Blinn JC), was held to seven carries and 14 yards. He had a long rush of 14.

The offensive line is anchored by senior center Josh McNeil (Killeen/Killeen). The scheduled starters on the left side of McNeil are sophomore Mike Slayden (Helotes/O'Connor) at left tackle and sophomore Jerry Hill (Copperas Cove/Copperas Cove) at left guard.

On the right side of McNeil are sophomore right guard Josh Goodlow (Austin/McCallum) and freshman Jacob Laubach (San Antonio/Smithson Valley).

Laubach started for the first time last week against UMHB. Slayden, Hill, Goodlow, and Laubach have a combined eight collegiate starts between them. McNeil has started 31 games in his Bulldog career.

The place-kicker for TLU is freshman Allen Cain (San Antonio/Stevens). Cain was put into service last week against UMHB for the first field goal of his young career. Cain missed wide right on a 32-yard field goal in the fourth quarter. On the year, Cain is 4-for-4 on extra-point attempts.

The holder for Cain is punter Frank Vera (Laredo/Nixon), who has thrown three career TD passes. Two of the three TD tosses have come on fake field goal attempts.

#### **ETBU Defense**

Nine starters are back on defense, including the ASC's Preseason Defensive Player of the Year in senior defensive end Austin Sturrock (6-3, 230/Sour Lake, TX).

A fifth-year senior, Sturrock earned his first All-ASC recognition last season after leading the conference in tackles for loss and finishing with 48 tackles and a team-high 5 ½ sacks. He recovered two fumbles and forced another pair.

Sturrock is off to a great start in 2009. He's leading the Tigers in tackles (18), tackles for loss (5.0 for 19 yards), and sacks (2.0 for 7). Last week against Sul Ross State, Sturrock collected a season-best 11 tackles, with two tackles for loss (for 8 yards in losses).

The Tigers defense as a whole allowed 379 yards against the Lobos last week. The Lobos rushed for 233 yards against ETBU and averaged 6.0 yards per carry. Sul Ross had two rushing touchdowns, including a 41-yard run by Cameron Holiness in the first quarter.

ETBU held Sul Ross to 3-of-10 passing with two interceptions. The Lobos threw for 146 yards, with 74 of the yards coming on one play – a 74-yard TD pass to Rod Jefferson. ETBU interceptions went to cornerback Gerald Hunter and free safety Frank Williams.

Senior linebacker Josh Zamora was second on the team in total tackles last week against Sul Ross. Zamora had four solo tackles and three tackle assists. Back-up linebacker Michael Uvalle and starting defensive end DeMarkus Conway, a freshman, each recorded five tackles.

Starting defensive tackle Evan Beaton, a junior, had three tackles and a blocked extra-point last week against the Lobos.

The Tigers run a 4-2-5 defensive alignment. ETBU will have four down linemen, two linebackers, and five Tigers in the secondary. ETBU goes with two cornerbacks, a strong safety, a weak safety, and a free safety.

## **When the Tigers Have The Ball**

### **ETBU Offense**

The Tigers have relied on the running game in their first three. ETBU has gained 422 yards on the ground, compared to the 311 yards through the air. The Tigers have 128 rushing attempts and only 46 passing attempts. Of those 46 attempts, ETBU has completed 18 and thrown five interceptions.

The ETBU running game is largely comprised of three players – junior tailbacks Jair Stover and Corey George and sophomore quarterback Sed Harris. On the season, Stover has a team-best 173 yards rushing on a team-high 45 carries. Last week, Stover rushed 19 times for 93 yards, with a long of 12.

George has 35 carries and 109 yards gained. He has a team-best three rushing TDs (all coming last week against Sul Ross). George rushed 25 times for 109 yards in the win over the Lobos. He had a long rush of 14 yards.

Harris carried the ball nine times for 97 yards and scored on a 42-yard run. On the year, Harris has 145 yards rushing on 24 carries, an average of 6.0 yards per carry.

Harris doesn't throw the ball often. In fact, three different ETBU players have thrown a pass this year. Harris is 11-for-27 with two touchdowns and three interceptions. He has a long connection of 69 yards (completed to Trevor Cavness). Harris also had a 65-yard hook-up with Raefe Jenkins last week against Sul Ross. Harris's TD pass last week went to tight end Craig Blankenship (a pass of 10 yards).

The Tigers starting offensive line brings an average weight of 302 pounds and an average height of 6-foot-1 into Saturday's contest. Junior right tackle Jason Guillory is 6-4 and 350 pounds. The Tigers have two starting seniors on the offensive line – left guard Stephen Nicasio and center Jonathan Council. ETBU does start two freshmen linemen – left tackle Zach Mullins and right guard Andrew Boyce.

### **TLU Defense**

The TLU defensive unit has allowed an average of 40.5 points over the first two contests. Of course, after allowing 59 points last week against UMHB, that average is a little deceiving.

The Bulldogs played well defensively in the season-opening 22-21 loss to now-No. 18 Trinity. In fact, TLU was spectacular against the run in the loss to Trinity. The Bulldogs held Trinity to 21 yards on 31 carries.

But against UMHB, the TLU defense could not stop the Cru in the running or passing game. UMHB scored on nine of its first 11 possessions. Eight of the scores were touchdowns. UMHB nearly had another first-quarter TD, but the Cru fumbled at the TLU 4-yard line. UMHB collected 614 yards of total offense, rushing for 354 and throwing for 260. The Cru averaged 8.4 yards per carry and 11.3 yards per pass attempt.

The Bulldogs have gone with a 4-3-4 alignment in their first two contests. TLU will have a new starter at one of the linebacking spots. Sophomore Trey Parma, a part-time starter in 2008, is scheduled to start Saturday.

Up front, the Bulldogs are led by three seniors – defensive end John Jackson, nose tackle Eric Walker, and defensive tackle James Villarreal. Walker leads the team with 3.5 tackles for loss and with two sacks. Villarreal also has two sacks. The other starting defensive lineman is end Chris Kyle, who has 10 total tackles, two tackles for loss and a sack in his first two collegiate games.

The starting linebackers are junior Jack Moses, junior Joseph Mendoza, and Parma. Moses leads the team in tackles with 20, including 2.0 tackles for loss and a forced fumble.

The secondary is paced by sophomore strong safety Dantrell Anderson, who had a team-best 12 tackles last week against UMHB. Anderson is second on the team in total tackles, with 16. He leads the team in solo tackles, with 13. Anderson also has two pass break-ups. The Bulldogs have yet to intercept a pass, but the team does have nine pass break-ups.

TLU's starting punter is Frank Vera, who is always a threat to punt, pass or run when he has the ball. Vera has three career TD passes, and he is adept at running for first downs when a snap or two goes bad. Vera is 2-for-2 in the passing department this year for 34 yards and a 19-yard TD strike. He has also rushed 15 yards on a carry for a first down. Vera has punted 13 times in 2009 for 512 yards (an average of 39.4). He has a long of 51. Vera's punts have ended in the opponents' 20-yard line five times, and he has forced six fair catches.

- TLU quarterbacks Jarret Buchholtz (Luling/Luling/Texas College) and freshman Rocky Huff (Houston/Jersey Village) were a combined 12-for-28 with three interceptions. Buchholtz threw for 142 yards with two picks. He was sacked three times. Huff, last week's starter in a 1-point loss to Trinity, was 0-for-2 with an interception and a sack. Huff threw an interception to UMHB's Javicz Jones, who returned the pick 61 yards for a touchdown in the second quarter. UMHB's final three scores of the first half covered 61, 54, and 58 yards, respectively.

- Junior quarterback Jarret Buchholtz (Luling/Luling/Texas College) made his first career start at quarterback for TLU in last Saturday's loss to No. 3-ranked University of Mary Hardin-Baylor. Buchholtz was 11-for-24 with two interceptions and a 43-yard TD pass to Jonathon Randle (Prairie View/Waller). The TD pass to Randle came as time expired in regulation. The TD pass was Buchholtz's first as a Bulldog. Buchholtz faced constant pressure vs. UMHB, and he was sacked three times.

- Jonathan Randle's TD grab against UMHB was his first TD catch since Nov. 3, 2007, in a conference loss to Hardin-Simmons. Randle missed all of 2008 with a knee injury suffered just prior to the 2008 season. Randle's TD grab Saturday v. UMHB was his third career touchdown catch. The senior had four catches for 77 yards in the loss to the Cru.

- Dantrell Anderson tied his career-best for tackles in a game when had 12 last week against UMHB. Against the Cru, Anderson had nine solo tackles and three tackle assists. He also had a half-tackle for loss and a pass break-up. The 12 total tackles for Anderson tied his individual career-high, which he set last year in a home victory over Sul Ross State on Oct. 11, 2008.

- Defensive back Gary Cooper (Houston/Nimitz/Southwestern (Kan.)) had a career-high 11 tackles for the Bulldogs last week. Cooper, a sophomore, had seven solo tackles and four tackle assists, with a half-tackle for loss.

- Junior linebacker Jack Moses (San Antonio/Churchill) was one tackle shy of tying his career-high with 11 tackles last week vs. UMHB. Moses's career-high is 12, which came last year against Mississippi College.

- TLU senior running back Anthony Smith (Bay City/Bay City/Blinn JC) is closing in on the career mark for rushing among backs in TLU's NCAA DIII era. Smith has 1,544 career rushing yards. Kenny Gransberry has TLU's DIII-era record with 2,215 yards gained over four seasons (2001-04). The overall TLU career rushing record is held by Royce Johnson (3,537, 1969-72).

- Anthony Smith became the TLU DIII-era kickoff returns leaders last week with his second kickoff return against Mary Hardin-Baylor. Smith's second return was his 56<sup>th</sup> career kickoff return as a Bulldog. He eclipsed the career total of Mario Martinez, who had 55 kick returns in his TLU career. Smith also surpassed Martinez for the most kickoff return yard in the TLU DIII era. Smith needed 20 yards to pass Martinez. On Saturday, Smith had 10 returns for 169 yards. Smith now has 64 career kickoff returns for 1,340 yards (an average of 20.9 per return). Former Bulldog Brandon Kyle holds the TLU record for kickoff return average (22.0).

- Frank Vera (Laredo/Nixon) entered last week's game with UMHB with a career punting average just a hair under 38.0 yards per punt. Last week vs. UMHB, Vera punted six times for 263 yards with an average of 43.8 yards per punt. Last week's performance put Vera's career average at 38.15 (124 punts for 4,730 yards). He currently stands as TLU's DIII-era career leader punting average (with a minimum of 50 punts). The former record-holders were Dane Hughes and Trey Brezina, who each finished their TLU careers with 38.0 average.

- Vera completed another pass last week against UMHB, and it came on another fourth-down trick play. The Bulldogs converted a first down and moved into UMHB territory with Vera's 15-yard pass to Steven Thrash (Hubbard/Hubbard). For the year thus far, Vera is 2-for-2 for 34 yards and a TD. In the season-opening 22-21 loss to Trinity, Vera tossed the third TD pass of his career and in large part helped him to earn ASC Special Teams Player of the Week honors for that week. Vera earned the ASC weekly honor after throwing for a touchdown on a fake field goal and after pinning five punts inside the 20-yard line in the Trinity game. Against the Tigers, Vera gave TLU its first lead of the night when he fired a 19-yard TD pass to Steven Thrash in the second quarter. Vera took the snap on what appeared to be a 26-yard field goal attempt by Allen Cain. But Vera rose up out of his stance and tossed a perfect strike to Thrash, who was uncovered on the far right sideline. All of Frank Vera's three career TD passes have come on trick plays (two fake field goal attempts and one half-back option pass).
