Dennis Parker is in his third year as head coach for the Texas Lutheran Bulldogs. Parker returned to his Texas coaching roots in 2007 after coaching in Mesa, Ariz., at Mesa High School, for three seasons. Parker led TLU to a two-win improvement in 2008. TLU went 4-6 last season after opening with a 2-8 campaign in 2007, Parker's first year with the program. Parker was hired on Jan. 22, 2007 as the 22nd coach in school history.

Parker was the head coach at North Texas for the 1991, 1992 and 1993 seasons. Parker was also an assistant coach at Southeast Missouri State University from 1977 to 1981. Parker won a state championship at Marshall High School in Marshall, Texas in 1990. Parker took the job at Marshall after serving as the offensive coordinator for Converse Judson on its 1983 state championship team.

MCMURRY HEAD COACH: Hal Mumme, 1st Season
Record at McMurry: 3-4 (3-2 ASC)

Record vs. TLU: First meeting

In 18 seasons as a collegiate head coach, Hal Mumme's primary starting quarterbacks in his Air Raid Offense have averaged 3,686.7 yards and 31.72 touchdown passes per season. Mumme's stop at NCAA Division III is the first in his career. Although he's been a head coach at the NAIA, NCAA Division II, NCAA Division I-AA and NCAA Division I ranks. Perhaps the most recognized name on Mumme's list of quarterback alumni is Tim Couch. Couch played for Mumme two seasons at the University of Kentucky before becoming the NFL's No. 1 draft pick in 1999 by the Cleveland Browns. But as a collegian, and the Heisman Trophy Award runner-up, Couch passed for 73 touchdown passes and 8,159 yards in two seasons in the Air Raid system in perhaps college football's most elite conference, the SEC.

Game Overview

Texas Lutheran and McMurry meet Saturday for the 26th time in their respective football histories. The Bulldogs have had a recent run of success against McMurry by winning seven of the last eight times against the team from Abilene. McMurry last tasted victory against TLU on Oct. 4, 2003 with a 42-39 victory in Seguin.

Since that road victory over TLU in 2003, McMurry has dropped five straight to TLU. In those five losses, McMurry has lost three in Abilene and two in Seguin.

In 2009, the two teams enter this American Southwest Conference contest heading in two very different directions. McMurry, under first-year head coach Hal Mumme, has won three games in a row after enduring a 2-22 stretch that ran over the previous two seasons and the first four games of 2009.

McMurry's three conference wins have put them in third place in the ASC with a 3-2 league mark.

The Bulldogs are 0-6 coming off last week's non-conference 53-18 loss to NCAA Division II independent University of the Incarnate Word. The TLU losing skid is at nine overall with the six losses in 2009 combined with the final three losses of the 2008 campaign.

TLU's nine-game losing streak is its longest of the university's NCAA Division III era, which began in 1998. A loss Saturday to McMurry would match the longest losing skid in TLU's overall football history.

In the overall TLU football history, the nine-game skid is the longest since a 10-game winless streak that stretched over the 1986 and 1987 seasons. The school record for most consecutive losses (10) has been matched on three different occasions.

TLU had a 13-game winless streak stretching over the 1954, 1955 and 1956 seasons. The Bulldogs had a tie in the 1955 season that kept the team winless but that stopped the consecutive games with a loss stretch at 10.

WHEN TLU HAS THE BALL ...

Texas Lutheran Offense

The Bulldogs will start their fourth different quarterback in seven games when scheduled starter Luke Davis takes the first Bulldog snap on Saturday. That snap will be the first varsity snap of Davis's career. Davis is a 6-foot-3, 195-pound sophomore squad member from Baytown, Texas (Baytown Christian). Davis has seen time at quarterback on the junior varsity squads in 2008 and 2009. He has not appeared in a varsity game in his TLU career.

The Bulldogs have started quarterbacks Rocky Huff (vs. Trinity), Jarret Buchholtz (vs. Mary Hardin-Baylor, East Texas Baptist, Howard Payne, and Sul Ross State), and David Jones (vs. Incarnate Word).

TLU is last in the American Southwest Conference in scoring offense (16.2), total offense (247.3 yards per game), interceptions thrown (15), first downs (84), third-down conversions (28.4 percent), and turnover margin (-3.00 per game).

TLU's leading rusher is junior Quinten Cleveland (Galveston/Ball), who has gained 188 yards on 54 carries, an average per carry of 3.5

yards. Cleveland scored his first career rushing TD last week in the loss to Incarnate Word.

Anthony Smith is TLU's second-leading rusher (169 yards) and second-leading receiver (191 yards). Smith is second in the ASC in all-purpose yardage at 143.2 per game. In addition to his rushing and receiving numbers, Smith has 479 kickoff return yards and 20 yards on punt returns.

Steven Thrash (Hubbard/Hubbard) is the top receiving threat for the Bulldogs. Thrash is fourth in the league in receiving yards per game (73.8). He has 30 catches for 443 yards with four touchdowns.

The Bulldogs will have two new starters on the offensive line for the McMurry game. Junior and two-year letterman Andrew Wueste (6-4, 240, San Antonio/Churchill) will start at left tackle, and sophomore squad member Jordan Gesch (6-3, 300, Round Rock/Round Rock) gets the start at left guard. Matt Cannata, Josh Goodlow and Jacob Laubach again will start for the Bulldogs at center, right guard and right tackle, respectively.

McMurry Defense

While the McMurry "Air Raid" offense gets most of the attention, the McMurry defense is a very serviceable unit for Head Coach Hal Mumme and his staff. McMurry is seventh in total defense, allowing an average of 395.6 yards per game, but points are what matter most. In fact, beginning with the 45-21 win over East Texas Baptist on Oct. 3, the McMurry defense has allowed only three combined points in the second halves of the team's three consecutive wins.

Although the team surrenders an average of 32.1 points per game for the season, in the last three games (all wins) the defense has given up only 20.1 per game. Throw out the 61 points allowed to Mississippi College and the 41 allowed to then No. 3-ranked Mary Hardin-Baylor, McMurry has allowed opponents a scoring average of 24.6.

McMurry runs a 4-2-5 defensive alignment with four down linemen, two linebackers, and five defensive backs (two strong safeties, two cornerbacks, and a free safety).

Senior linebacker Andrew Wallace is McMurry's leading tackler. The 6-1, 205 defensive standout has 72 total tackles, a number that leads the American Southwest Conference. Wallace has 26 solo stops and 46 tackle assists. He has 3.5 tackles for loss, a half sack, two recovered fumbles, and a forced fumble.

Fellow linebacker Nick Hernandez is third on the team in total tackles but tied for the lead in tackles for loss, with 6.0 for 19 yards. Hernandez shares the tackle for loss lead with defensive tackle Josh McKinnis, a 6-1 and 250-pound junior. McKinnis has 6.0 tackles for 33 yards in losses. He also has two sacks, a fumble recovery, and a forced fumble.

In the secondary, cornerback Gene Hudson is tied for the ASC lead with three interceptions. He has six pass break-ups and nine passes defended.

McMurry has used four different punters in 2009. Even QB Jake Mullin has punted. He has 11 punts for 448 yards (an average of 40.7). Starting punter for this week is John Kowalski, who averages 45.4 per boot, with a long of 66 and three punts more than 50 yards.

WHEN MCMURRY HAS THE BALL ...

McMurry Offense

McMurry's "Air Raid" offense provides 88 percent of the total offense for the team. Of its 2,683 yards gained on offense in 2009, McMurry has thrown for 2,361. McMurry is No. 1 in the ASC and No. 9 in the NCAA Division III in passing offense, with an average passing yardage per game of 337.29.

Jake Mullin, the 6-3 and 225-pound sophomore, pulls the trigger on the

McMurry offense. Mullin is the conference leader and ranked ninth nationally in total offense, at 331.29 yards per game. He also ranked 36th in the nation in passing efficiency. Mullin has thrown for 2,298 yards with 19 TDs and just seven picks. He is completing 66.4 percent of his passes, and he has a long completion of 83 yards.

The McMurry rushing attack is last in the league with an average of 46 yards per game. McMurry has scored six rushing TDs (two more than TLU) but has an average per rush of only 1.9.

McMurry receiving corps has six players with more than 20 receptions in 2009. The leader is Marcus Franklin, who has caught 38 passes for 595 yards and has scored four touchdowns. Tight end Delfonte Diamond is second on the team in catches (36) and second on the team in touchdowns (5). He has the long catch of 83. Antwaun Harris and Chantz Purvis each have 25 grabs in '09. Harris has two receiving TDs.

McMurry's leading scorer is receiver R.J. Long (6-2, 190), who has caught six touchdown passes in 21 receptions. He averages 14.3 yards per catch and has a long of 71.

The McMurry offensive line starts three sophomores (at left guard, at right guard, and at right tackle), a junior (at left tackle), and senior Josh Clements (6-1, 280) at center. Right tackle Micah Farris is the biggest of the o-linemen. Farris stands 6-3 and weighs 300.

Field goal kicker Jesse Garcia is 3-for-6 on field goal attempts. Garcia is 1-for-3 from 20-29 yards, 2-for-2 from 30-39, and 0-for-1 from 40-49. He has a long of 38, and he has one field goal attempt blocked. On extra-point attempts, he is 21-for-22.

Texas Lutheran Defense

The Bulldogs surrender an average of 41 points per game. TLU is last in the ASC in scoring defense and rushing defense (226.67 yards per game). This week against McMurry, the TLU secondary will be put to the test. The Bulldogs hope to have corners Leonard Durand and Acie Washington back from injury. Durand and Washington have each missed the last three games. Zack Weathersby and Brandon McCoy have started at the corners in their absence.

The remainder of the secondary is now manned by true freshman Justin Guerrero and sophomore transfer Gary Cooper, who has 17 tackles and five tackles for loss in his last two games.

In TLU's revamped defensive scheme, now a 3-4, leading tackler Dantrell Anderson is listed at inside linebacker. The sophomore from Cedar Hill is second in the conference in total tackles, with 57 (an average of 9.5 per game). Anderson has 6.5 tackles for loss (for 21 yards), a half sack and four pass break-ups.

Anderson is joined in the linebacking corps by senior Jack Moses, sophomore Josh Arce, and freshman Kevin Cossey. Moses is fifth in the conference in total tackles (with 51). Last week against UIW, Moses had eight tackles. Cossey recorded seven tackles last week, and Arce had three stops with a fumble recovery.

The TLU defensive line has seen its share of injury in 2009. TLU still is scheduled to be without starting defensive end John Jackson and starting defensive tackle James Villarreal. Both players are seniors. In their absence, freshman defensive end Chris Kyle and senior nose tackle Eric Walker have tried to fill the gaps. Kyle is tied for third on the team in tackles, with 32, and he is second on the squad in tackles for loss, with 6.5 for 33. Walker also has 32 tackles and leads the team in tackles for loss, with 7.5 for 32 yards.

Frank Vera handles the punting for TLU. The senior from Laredo is third in the ASC in punting average, at 38.6. Vera has a long of 51, nine fair catches forced, and eight punts inside the opponent's 20.

In the first football meeting between old Heart of Texas Conference

rivals, Incarnate Word opened a 32-0 lead over Texas Lutheran at the half and cruised to a 53-18 win over the Bulldogs.

At Gayle and Tom Benson Stadium on the UIW campus, the NCAA Division II independent Cardinals scored on their first two offensive possessions and established dominance over the Bulldogs, a member of the NCAA Division III and the American Southwest Conference.

TLU dropped to 0-6 overall with the non-conference loss. UIW won its third straight game and moved to 4-4 overall. The Cardinals are in their first season of collegiate football.

UIW's Dominic Hamilton caught two TD passes, one from Thomas Specia and one from Eric Massoni. Hamilton finished with six catches for 123 yards.

Cardinal receiver Todd Walker added two catches for 55 yards and had a 46-yard grab for a TD in the first quarter. UIW quarterbacks Massoni, Specia and Paden Lynch combined for five TD tosses, 266 yards passing with 17 completions in 25 attempts. Massoni was 11-for-15 for 176 yards and three TDs. The Cardinals also rushed 49 times for 213 yards and held TLU to a net rushing total of 72.

Through the first quarter, TLU ran 14 plays and produced only 39 yards. By the half, the play total hit 30 and the total offense number dropped to 21 yards. The Bulldogs opened the game with a new-look offense and a new quarterback, redshirt freshman David Jones, who had yet to take a varsity snap in 2009. Jones rushed seven times for -19 yards and went 2-for-10 for five yards and two interceptions.

After the half, TLU scrapped the run-oriented offense and went to a four-wide set with former starter Jarret Buchholtz at quarterback. With the game already well in hand for UIW and with UIW playing many of its reserves, Buchholtz led TLU to two fourth-quarter scoring drives and produced a pair of two-point conversions.

TLU's Quintten Cleveland scored on a five-yard run at the 11:16 mark of the fourth quarter. Cleveland then caught a pass for the two-point conversion.

Buchholtz capped the game's scoring with 52 seconds to play on a TD strike to Jonathon Randle that covered 11 yards. Randle then made a grab on the two-point conversion.

The Bulldogs' first two points of the game, scored at the 8:38 mark of the third quarter with TLU trailing 39-0, came on a safety. UIW snapped a ball out of the endzone on a punt attempt.

LAST WEEK FOR MCMURRY

After going 2-18 in 2007 and 2008 as a football program, McMurry University's 35-28 Homecoming win over Sul Ross State gives the team its third win in 2009. Jake Mullin threw for 377 yards and four touchdowns and the McMurry defense shutout an opponent in the second half at Wilford Moore Stadium for the second consecutive time.

In front of 3,100 fans waiting to see what first-year head coach Hal Mumme had to offer, McMurry and Sul Ross exchanged touchdowns and went into the locker room knotted at 21.

However, McMurry's defense stiffened in the second half as it has done every week the past three helping McMurry win three consecutive times for the first time since the 2000 season. In fact, beginning with the 45-21 win over East Texas Baptist Oct. 3, the McMurry defense has allowed only three combined points in the second halves of all three victories for the maroon and white.

Dominique Carson, the Sul Ross quarterback, carried the ball for 84 yards on 11 attempts. However, Carson left the game on a trainer's cart in the third quarter and did not return.

The injury came following McMurry's nine-play 67-yard touchdown drive to begin the second half capped by Mullin's 26-yard touchdown strike to Marcus Franklin giving McMurry a 28-21 lead.

Then, Sul Ross took over after the kickoff on its own 30-yard line. On second down, Carson carried for two yards and was gang-tackled by Jared Villanueva and Blake Shuler. Unfortunately for the Lobos, the two-yard gain by Carson would be the gain of the day by the star quarterback as he left with an ankle injury.

The Lobos would put the game in the hands of freshman quarterback Zack Bossier and fullback Cameron Holliness. Holliness responded with a game-high 112 yards rushing on 18 attempts. However, Sul Ross couldn't muster up an offensive score in the second half.

Mullin's fourth touchdown pass of the game went to R.J. Long who hauled in his second touchdown reception with 14:56 left in the fourth quarter from 15-yards away.

LAST MEETING – TLU 18, MCMURRY 0 (Oct. 25, 2009 in Abilene, Texas)

The Texas Lutheran Bulldogs held McMurry to 26 yards of total offense and forced five turnovers in an 18-0 shutout at Wilford Moore Stadium in Abilene.

TLU won its third consecutive game and moved to 4-3 overall and to 3-2 in the American Southwest Conference. McMurry lost its 11th game in a row (dating back to the end of the 2007 season) and dropped to 0-8 overall and to 0-6 in the ASC.

The shutout for TLU was its first since a 45-0 defeat of Austin College on Sept. 2, 2006 in Seguin.

TLU set a new school record for fewest passing yards by an opponent, holding McMurry to 21 yards through the air. McMurry completed 4-of-16 passes and threw three interceptions. The old TLU record for fewest passing yards by an opponent was set in 1974 against Trinity. The Bulldogs held the Tigers to 25 passing yards in a 37-0 victory.

TLU held McMurry without a third-down conversion (0-for-13) and limited McMurry to 46 total offensive plays. McMurry rushed 30 times for five yards.

The Bulldogs recorded eight tackles for loss, resulting in 43 yards in losses. The Bulldogs also picked up five sacks (for 40 yards), recovered two fumbles, tallied 84 interception return yards and broke up four passes.
