Dennis Parker is in his third year as head coach for the Texas Lutheran Bulldogs. Parker returned to his Texas coaching roots in 2007 after coaching in Mesa, Ariz., at Mesa High School, for three seasons.

Parker led TLU to a two-win improvement in 2008. TLU went 4-6 last season after opening with a 2-8 campaign in 2007, Parker's first year with the program. Parker was hired on Jan. 22, 2007 as the 22nd coach in school history.

Parker has collegiate coaching experience as the head coach of NCAA Division I University of North Texas. He coached at North Texas for the 1991, 1992 and 1993 seasons. Parker was also an assistant coach at Southeast Missouri State University from 1977 to 1981.

Parker won a state championship at Marshall High School in Marshall, Texas in 1990. Parker took the job at Marshall after serving as the offensive coordinator for Converse Judson on its 1983 state championship team.

While at Converse Judson, Parker coached for Texas Lutheran Hall of Famer Frank Arnold as Arnold's offensive coordinator. Another TLU Hall of Famer, Rutledge, was the defensive coordinator at Converse Judson while Parker was the Judson offensive coordinator.

Texas Lutheran makes its second long road trip of the 2009 season, and again the Bulldogs take to the road in search of the year's first victory. The Bulldogs have been close to victories twice, against Trinity and East Texas Baptist, and have had two lopsided losses (to Howard Payne and Mary Hardin-Baylor).

Sul Ross enters Saturday's game after an idle week. The Lobos should still be riding high after a road win in Brownwood, Texas over Howard Payne on Sept. 26. The Lobos defeated HPU 31-14 in Gordon Wood Stadium.

The Lobos have done away with the pass-happy offensive style of a few years ago and now sport a triple-option ground attack.

TLU is balanced in its offensive approach but turnovers have been the problem. TLU is last in the ASC in turnover margin. Last week the Bulldogs committed seven in the loss to Howard Payne.

Injury and sickness have also started to take a toll on the Bulldogs. The depth on the offensive and defensive lines is of particular concern to the Bulldogs.

Last Week for TLU

Texas Lutheran committed seven turnovers Saturday in a 45-23 American Southwest Conference loss to Howard Payne at Seguin's Matador Stadium.

The seven turnovers matched the most single-game turnovers for the Bulldogs since reinstating football in 1998. (TLU had seven turnovers in 2008 against Hardin-Simmons and seven in 2002 against Louisiana College.)

TLU dropped to 0-4 overall and to 0-3 in the American Southwest Conference. Howard Payne improved to 3-1 overall and to 1-1 in the ASC.

HPU quarterback Zach Hubbard threw for 307 yards and four touchdowns. He tossed two TD passes to Edward Cody and had touchdowns to Tre Mason and Cody Hambrick. The TD connection from Hubbard to Hambrick came with 26 seconds to play in the first half and put the Yellow Jackets ahead 42-20.

TLU freshman place-kicker Allen Cain nailed a 36-yard field goal as the first half ended to make HPU's halftime lead 42-23. Cain's field goal would be the last score for TLU in the game.

HPU managed only a field goal in the second half, but the Yellow Jackets' defense tossed a shutout against TLU in the final 30 minutes of regulation.

TLU tossed three of its four interceptions in the second half. The Bulldogs' second-half possessions produced two punts, two changes of possession on downs, and three interceptions.

HPU scored a defensive touchdown in the first quarter when Jake Dezell recovered a TLU fumble in the endzone. The defensive score gave HPU a 14-0 lead.

HPU defensive lineman Allen Dixon forced two fumbles, had a sack, and recorded six total tackles. Yellow Jacket defensive back Eric Bunch intercepted two passes.

TLU junior quarterback Jarret Buchholtz tossed three touchdowns to go with the four interceptions. He completed 24 passes in 49 attempts. He was sacked twice.

Bulldog senior wide receiver Steven Thrash caught eight passes for 109 yards, with a 47-yard TD reception in the first quarter. For Thrash, the game was his second consecutive contest with more than 100 yards receiving.

Safety/linebacker Dantrell Anderson led TLU with 12 total tackles. Eleven of Anderson's tackles were solo stops. He also had three tackles for loss, a pass break-up, and two quarterback hurries.

TLU junior linebacker Jack Moses collected 10 tackles (eight solo), and redshirt freshman safety David Jones made his first collegiate interception.

Rondie Singletary had a blocked field goal for TLU in the second quarter.

Last Game for Sul Ross (two weeks ago v. HPU)

Dominique Carson paced the offense with 21 carries and 107 yards to help lead Sul Ross to a 31-14 conference victory over Howard Payne at Brownwood's Gordon Wood Stadium.

The win against the Yellow Jackets marks the fourth straight outing the Lobos have had the upper hand against HPU going back to 2006's 60-56 Sul Ross victory at Jackson Field.

Carson and Laurence Smith added a score each in the victory on Saturday. Carson took to the air 11 times completing six passes for 168 yards with a touchdown. Lobo wide out Roderick Jefferson posted four receptions for 143 yards.

Senior place kicker Michael Van Wagner was perfect on extra points and field goal tries hitting four of four extra attempts along with a 20-yard field goal late in the game.

Tony Allen led the defense for the second consecutive week with six tackles, all solo. Allen had a breakup for the afternoon while Carlton Perkins added three breakups.

The Lobos scored first on their opening drive as Smith sprinted 43 yards into the HPU end zone. Van Wagner was good on the extra point kick and gave Sul Ross an early 7-0 lead.

Sully struck gold again on the ensuing kickoff as the Yellow Jacket return man coughed up the ball in the Howard Payne end zone with a team recovery for the visitors. Van Wagner nailed the extra point and put the Lobos up 14-0 at the 12:02 mark, first quarter.

With ten seconds left in the second quarter, Carson cashed in on a three-yard hopper after an eight-play, 51-yard drive. Van Wagner's kick was good with Sul Ross sporting a commanding 21-0 lead at intermission.

The Lobos went to the passing game early in the third period as Carson found Jefferson on a 76-yard strike. Van Wagner nailed the extra point with the Lobos up 28-0 with 12:06 remaining in the third.

Howard Payne put up the next pair of scores, both in the third quarter as Walter Pam scampered one-yard capping a 10-play, 71-yard march. The kick by Mitchell Bailey was good and pulled the Yellow Jackets to within 21, trailing 28-7 with 9:11 left in the third.

The Jackets went to the air at 4:55 as Zach Hubbard connected to Trevor Kleine from 13 yards out. Bailey converted the extra point and cut the HPU deficit in half trailing 28-14.

Van Wagner then lined up for a 20-yard field goal at the 9:31 mark in the closing period to give Sully a 31-14 advantage.

Howard Payne could not force a comeback as the Lobos picked up their first season and conference win for 2009.

The Lobos bump their mark to 1-3 on the season and 1-1 in conference play. Howard Payne suffers their first setback and drops to 2-1 on the year and opens conference play at 0-1.

When Texas Lutheran Has The Ball ...

TLU Offense

Turnovers have been the story for the TLU offense through four games of the 2009 season. TLU has lost seven fumbles and thrown 11 interceptions. Three of the turnovers has turned into defensive touchdowns (a fumble recovered in the endzone and two interceptions returned for touchdowns).

TLU quarterbacks are completing just 48.6 percent of total passes, and three different passers have tossed interceptions. Starter Jarret Buchholtz has tossed five touchdowns and eight interceptions. He has thrown for 680 yards (an average of 226.7 per game) with a long

completion of 47 yards. Buchholtz also has a rushing TD. Buchholtz's top target remains Steven Thrash, the Hubbard native. Thrash went over the 100-yard mark for the second consecutive game with eight catches of 109 yards and a 47-yard TD reception. On the year, Thrash has 22 catches for 336 yards and three TDs. He averages 84 receiving yards per game.

On the ground, the Bulldogs average only 2.1 yards per carry. TLU has only three rushing TDs through the first four contests. Anthony Smith leads TLU with 137 yards on 51 carries. He has one rushing TD and one receiving touchdown. Quinten Cleveland had 109 yards on 34 carries. Cleveland caught a 26-yard TD pass last week from Buchholtz.

As a team, the Bulldogs are last in the conference in scoring offense (18.0) and eighth in total offense (272.5). TLU ranks eighth (out of nine teams) in rushing offense, with 65.5 yards per game. In passing offense, the Bulldogs are sixth with 200.0 yards per game. As for pass efficiency, TLU ranks eighth with an efficiency rating of 99.0. The Bulldogs are last in the conference in third-down conversions, 20-for-61 (32.8 percent).

TLU is last in the league in turnover margin, at -3.50 per game. TLU has committed 18 total turnovers and only gained four opponent turnovers, for a -14 overall turnover margin.

TLU is sixth in the ASC in kickoff return average, at 19.2 yards per return. The Bulldogs are last in punt return average, at 8.7.

Bulldog freshman kicker Allen Cain is 9-for-9 on point-after attempts. He is 1-for-2 on field goal attempts. He missed a 31-yarder against Mary Hardin-Baylor and made a 36-yarder against Howard Payne. Cain averages 52.3 yards on kickoffs.

SRSU Defense

The Lobos are eighth in the ASC in total defense by allowing 430.2 yards of total offense per game. Sul Ross State is last in the conference in rushing defense, surrendering 268 yards per game on the ground.

The Sul Ross pass defense is No. 1 in the conference. The Lobos have allowed just three passing TDs and have intercepted two passes. Opponents are completing just 52.9 percent of total passes against the Lobos. In terms of scoring defense, the Lobos are fifth in the league, giving up 31.5 points per game.

Sul Ross is last in the league in sack, with just one sack over the first four games. The Lobos are also last in the ASC in opponent third-down coverage. The team allows a 51.8 conversion rate for opponents on third down.

The Sul Ross State defense is usually on the field a good deal. The Lobos are last in the ASC in time of possession, at 26:45 per game.

Sul Ross has forced just four turnovers by opponents. The Lobos have two fumble recoveries and two interceptions.

Cornerback Johnnie Williams is the fourth-leading tackler in the ASC, with 34 total stops. Tony Allen is 11th in the league with 21 tackles. Devin Hudson has an interception, returned 56 yards for a touchdown.

When Sul Ross State Has The Ball ...

SRSU Offense

The Lobos and their triple option attack are the second-ranked rushing offense in the American Southwest Conference. The Lobos trail only No. 3-ranked Mary Hardin-Baylor in that category. Sul Ross averages 242.2 yards on the ground per game.

Because of the option game plan, the Lobos have attempted only 40

passes all season (the lowest total in the ASC). SRSU has completed 15 of the 40 attempts and thrown for 402 yards. The team has two TD passes and three thrown interceptions.

The ASC's leading rusher is Sul Ross QB Dominique Carson, who averages 6.8 yards per carry. Carson has rushed for 413 yards on 61 attempts, and he has five rushing TDs with a long of 64. Fullback Cameron Holliness is fifth in the conference in rushing, with 331 yards. Holliness averages 7.5 yards per carry and has scored three rushing touchdowns. Slot back Laurence Smith is another Lobo that averages over 6.1 yards per carry. Smith has two rushing TDs with a long run of 43.

The top receiver is Rod Jefferson, who has seven grabs for 199 yards. He has a long catch of 76 yards and a touchdown. Lee Carothers has three catches for 123 yards and a touchdown. He has a long grab of 74.

The Lobos have produced six plays of over 38 yards. Their longest play of the year has been a run of 83 yards by Cameron Holliness.

TLU Defense

The Bulldog defense is last in the ASC in scoring defense (39.5), seventh in total defense (419.5), seventh in rushing defense (200.0), and fifth in passing defense (219.5). The TLU rush defense allows 5.2 yards per carry and has allowed 10 rushing TDs. The TLU pass defense allows a completion percentage of 65.9 (the second-highest in the ASC). The Bulldogs have the fewest interceptions (two) in the conference. (TLU is tied with Sul Ross State for the fewest INTs in the league.

The Bulldogs traditionally use a 4-3 set, with linebacker Jack Moses and linebacker/safety Dantrell Anderson anchoring the unit. Moses, a junior, leads the team in tackles with 33. He has 2.5 tackles for loss with a forced fumble. Anderson comes off a game in which he had 12 tackles. Anderson now has 32 total stops with 3.5 tackles for loss. He also has four pass break-ups and two quarterback hurries.

Senior defensive tackle Eric Walker leads the team in tackles for loss with 5.5 for 28. Walker is tied for the team's sack lead with two for 15. Fellow defensive lineman Chris Kyle, a true freshman, is fourth on the team in total tackles, with 15.

TLU interceptions in 2009 have gone to Julio Reyes and to David Jones. Fumble recoveries have been claimed by James Villarreal and Zack Weathersby.

TLU senior punter Frank Vera is fourth in the conference in punting average. Vera averages 37.9 yards per punt. He has a long of 51.

Last Meeting – TLU vs. Sul Ross State

Oct. 11, 2008 in Seguin, Texas

Texas Lutheran 24, Sul Ross State 14

Texas Lutheran freshman safety Mark Alvarado (Victoria/Memorial) returned an interception 75 yards for a touchdown to stop a potential game-winning drive for Sul Ross State and to secure a 24-14 win for the Bulldogs.

At Seguin's Matador Stadium, TLU held a three-point edge (17-14) over Sul Ross State as Sul Ross drove into TLU territory. The Lobos had a 1st-and-10 from the TLU 22 before the Bulldog defense stiffened and forced Sul Ross QB Monte Morales into his third interception of the night.

Alvarado's interception came on 4th-and-20 for Sul Ross State from the TLU 32. Alvarado picked off the pass at the TLU 25 and scurried up the Sul Ross State sideline, picking up two key blocks from his teammates on his way to the endzone.

TLU improved to 3-3 overall and to 2-2 in the American Southwest Conference with its second victory of the season over Sul Ross State.

The Bulldogs defeated the Lobos on Sept. 6, in Alpine, 34-27 in overtime in each team's 2008 season-opener. The first meeting was a non-conference affair.

Sul Ross State dropped to 2-3 overall and to 1-2 in the ASC.

TLU took a 17-7 lead into the fourth quarter and appeared well on its way to the conference win after Joel Waldon (San Antonio/Judson) connected with Kash Greathouse (Gonzales/Gonzales) on a 31-yard TD pass at the 3:26 mark of the third quarter.

But Sul Ross State put together a six-play, 74-yard scoring drive after TLU missed a 43-yard field goal. The drive started with an additional 15 yards because of a TLU unsportsmanlike penalty and ended with a Rod Jefferson TD catch of six yards from Morales.

After the Jefferson score brought Sul Ross State within three points, at 17-14 with 4:15 to play in the game, the Lobos gambled with an onside kick. The gamble paid off with a recovery at the Sul Ross 43.

Three plays after recovering the onside kick, the Lobos were bordering on field goal range and threatening to score the go-ahead touchdown with a first down at the TLU 27. Another TLU penalty put the Lobos at 1st-and-10 at the TLU 22.

The Bulldogs' defense pushed Sul Ross State back to the TLU 32 with the help of three consecutive incomplete passes and a holding penalty. The 4th-and-20 play from the TLU 32 resulted in the Alvarado interception, the third of the night for the TLU secondary against Morales.

The Bulldogs did not commit a turnover against the Lobos. Waldon threw for 255 yards by completing 13 of 27 passes. The 255 yards from Waldon offset a poor night of running the ball by the Bulldogs. TLU managed just 12 yards on 38 carries, and leading rushing Anthony Smith (Bay City/Bay City/Blinn) was held to 18 yards on 17 carries. (Smith did break free for three receptions for 83 yards.)

Waldon tied the game at 7-7 in the second quarter with a 15-yard scramble for a touchdown. The QB scamper completed an eight-play, 69-yard drive that took 3:24 off the clock.
