TLU HEAD COACH: Dennis Parker, 3rd Season
Record at TLU: 6-19 (5-15 ASC)
Overall Collegiate Record: 17-40-1
Record vs. UIW: First meeting.

Dennis Parker is in his third year as head coach for the Texas Lutheran Bulldogs. Parker returned to his Texas coaching roots in 2007 after coaching in Mesa, Ariz., at Mesa High School, for three seasons. Parker led TLU to a two-win improvement in 2008. TLU went 4-6 last season after opening with a 2-8 campaign in 2007, Parker's first year with the program. Parker was hired on Jan. 22, 2007 as the 22nd coach in school history.

Parker was the head coach at North Texas for the 1991, 1992 and 1993 seasons. Parker was also an assistant coach at Southeast Missouri State University from 1977 to 1981. Parker won a state championship at Marshall High School in Marshall, Texas in 1990. Parker took the job at Marshall after serving as the offensive coordinator for Converse Judson on its 1983 state championship team.

UIW HEAD COACH: Mike Santiago, 1st Season

Prior to his arrival at UIW, Mike Santiago worked for two seasons as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Utah State University. His head coaching experiences were gained during six years as the leader at Stephen F. Austin University of the 1-AA Southland Conference. His cumulative mark there was 39-27 and the Lumberjacks won the 1999 conference title with an 8-3 mark the nation's best turnaround for that year. To date, that remains the school's only conference championship.

In addition to his stints at those two schools, the Arizona native was an assistant at McNeese State, Southwest Texas State, Western Michigan, Northern Arizona, North Carolina State and Lamar.

Texas Lutheran and Incarnate Word, former area college rivals from the old Heart of Texas Conference of the NAIA and NCAA Division II, meet for the first time in football this Saturday at UIW's Gayle and Tom Benson Stadium in San Antonio.

Incarnate Word, a NCAA Division II independent, is in its first year of collegiate football. The Cardinals and Head Coach Mike Santiago bring a record of 3-3 into the 2 p.m. contest.

TLU, a NCAA Division III member from the American Southwest Conference, is in search of its first victory of the 2009 season. The

Bulldogs are 0-5 this year and 0-4 in the ASC.

The Bulldogs have lost eight consecutive games dating back to the 2008 season, when the team dropped its final three contests. Out of those eight losses, TLU has been held to seven points or less in five of the games. The Bulldogs' average points per game in the eight losses is 12.38. In 2009 alone, TLU averages 15.8 points per game.

The Bulldogs are last in the American Southwest Conference in scoring offense (15.8), scoring defense (38.6), total offense (251.6), rushing defense (229.4), defensive interceptions (2), third-down conversion percentage (29.3), and turnover margin (-3.20 per game).

The Cardinals come off consecutive wins for the first time in school history. Two weeks ago, UIW defeated Oklahoma Panhandle State 38-35 in overtime on the road. Last week, UIW won for the second time at Benson Stadium, defeating East Central Oklahoma 38-20. The Cardinals other win of 2009 came in its season-opener against Monterrey Tech (42-39 on Aug. 29).

WHEN TLU HAS THE BALL ...

TLU OFFENSE

As mentioned earlier in this preview, the Bulldog offense ranks at or near the bottom of the American Southwest Conference in most offensive categories. The rushing and passing attacks have each struggled over the first five games of the 2009 season. The running game averages only 1.9 yards per carry and 59.4 yards per game. The passing game has a completion rate of 45.5 percent with 13 interceptions and eight touchdowns. TLU averages 192.2 yards of passing per contest.

TLU quarterbacks Jarret Buchholtz, junior from Luling, and Rocky Huff, freshman from Houston, each saw extended action in last week's loss to Sul Ross State. Buchholtz started the game and completed four of his 10 passes for 66 yards. He had two interceptions and a touchdown pass, a connection of 43 yards to senior Steven Thrash. Huff was 2-for-15 for 23 yards with a long of 12.

For the year, Buchholtz has completed 45.8 percent of his passes with 10 interceptions and six touchdowns. He has thrown for 746 yards. Huff is

18-for-41 (43.9 percent) with a touchdown and two interceptions.

TLU's leading receiver is Hubbard native Steven Thrash, who ranks third in the ASC in receiving yards per game (80.4) and third in the league in receptions per game (5.2). Thrash is second in the ASC in receiving TDs, with four. He has 26 grabs for 402 yards, with a long reception of 47.

The running game is led by junior Quinnten Cleveland and senior Anthony Smith. Cleveland leads the team with 153 yards on 46 carries. Smith, a three-year starter, has 61 carries for 147 yards and a touchdown. The Bulldogs have a total of three rushing touchdowns in 2009.

The offensive line is anchored by four-year starter Josh McNeil of Killeen. McNeil has started and played in all but one game in his four years on the field. McNeil is surrounded on the offensive line by true freshman Jacob Laubach at right tackle, sophomore Josh Goodlow at right guard, sophomore Jerry Hill at left guard, and sophomore Mike Slayden at left tackle.

UIW DEFENSE

The Cardinals allow 33.3 points, 222.8 rushing yards and 196.3 passing yards per game. The Cardinal pass defense allows opposing quarterbacks a completion percentage of only 47.8. The rushing defense surrenders gives up 5.2 yards per carry. Opposing teams have rushed for 1,337 yards and have scored 15 touchdowns in six games. Opposing teams have thrown for 10 touchdowns.

The Cardinal defense sports a 4-2-5 alignment, with four down linemen, two linebackers, and five defensive backs. The Cardinals have two cornerbacks, a left safety, a right safety, and a free safety.

The starting defensive line for the Cardinals averages 6-foot-3 and 236 pounds. Defensive tackles Chad Miles and Diego McClain are 6-4, 235 and 6-2, 255 respectively. McClain leads the Cardinals in tackles for loss with 11.5 for 25 yards. Defensive end Zach Zellars is the UIW sack leader with 3.5 for six yards in losses.

The leading tackler for the Cardinals is linebacker Dakota Mawyer, who has 43 stops, five tackles for loss and a half sack. Mawyer also has two pass break-ups, two passes defended, a quarterback hurry, and two forced fumbles.

Left safety Chaz Pavliska is second on the squad in tackles. He has 38 tackles, 6.5 tackles for loss and two sacks. Cornerback James Perez and free safety Aaron Hernandez are tied for the team lead in interceptions.

Opponents are 34-for-88 on third-down conversions and 5-for-9 on fourth down.

WHEN UIW HAS THE BALL ...

UIW OFFENSE

The Cardinals offense averages 24.8 points per game with rushing and passing attacks that post 324.3 yards of total offense per contest. The Cardinals pass for an average of 215.7 per game and rush for 108.7 yards per game.

The scheduled starter at quarterback for Saturday is Eric Massoni, who has played in five games. He is completing 52.4 percent of his passes. He has yet to throw an interception, and he has tossed six touchdowns. Massoni has a long completion of 58 yards.

The top two receiving threats for UIW are 6-1, 185-pound senior Todd Walker and 5-9, 175-pound redshirt freshman Dominic Hamilton. Walker has 15 catches for 230 yards with three touchdowns. He has a long catch of 73 yards. Hamilton averages 21.5 yards per catch. His 13 grabs have gone for 280 yards with four TDs and a long of 58.

The rushing attack for the Cardinals has produced only five touchdowns and average rush of 3.5 over the first six games. Leading rusher Trent Rios has gained 212 yards on 73 carries. He averages 2.9 yards per carry and does not have a rushing TD this season. Back-up quarterback Thomas Specia leads the Cardinals in rushing TDs, with two. Specia is also the team's second-leading rusher with 131 yards on 29 carries, an average per carry of 4.5. He has a long rush of 52.

The Cardinals offensive line will be the biggest offensive line that TLU has faced to date. Left tackle Jake Roby goes 6-5, 268 and lines up beside left guard Michael Palacios, who is 6-5 and 345. Center Patrick Martinez is the smallest of the bunch at 5-11 and 248. The right side of the line stands at 6-2, 294 with Charles Segura and 6-4, 282 with Jayson Hierlholzer. The tight end, Caleb Kocian, is 6-3 and 287.

TLU DEFENSE

The Bulldogs allow opponents 6.1 yards per play. Opposing offenses rush for an average of 229.4 yards and throw for an average of 181.6 yards. TLU surrenders 5.7 yards per carry. Fifteen of the 22 offensive touchdowns scored against TLU have come on the ground.

Opponents convert 37 percent of third-down chances (26 of 71) and 62 percent of fourth-down tries (5 of 8). TLU's red-zone defense allows a score 81 percent of the time and a touchdown 48 percent of the time.

The Bulldogs have been beset by injury and sickness on defense, particularly on the defensive line. Starting defensive end John Jackson and starting defensive tackle James Villarreal each missed last week's game at Sul Ross State. Their availability for this week's contest is doubtful.

With several key players missing in action last week, the Bulldogs showed a 3-3-5 defensive formation last week against Sul Ross State. In this new alignment, freshman defensive end Chris Kyle enjoyed a career day. The McAllen native registered 15 tackles (six solo, nine assists), two tackles for nine yards in losses, and a sack for seven yards.

Redshirt freshman safety David Jones continued to show his worth in the secondary. Jones, who transitioned from quarterback to receiver to safety in the last two months, had 10 tackles and a tackle for loss last week. Linebacker Jack Moses and linebacker/safety Dantrell Anderson each combined for 19 tackles, and safety Gary Cooper recorded four tackles for loss in his seven total tackles. Cooper now is second on the team in tackles for loss with 5.5.

Defensive tackle Eric Walker continues to lead the team in tackles for loss. The senior leads the squad with six for 28 yards in losses. Walker also is tied for the team lead in sacks, with 2.0. Walker shares the lead with Kyle and Villarreal.

Moses is the team's leading tackler, with 44 stops over the first five games. He has 2.5 tackles for loss and two forced fumbles. Anderson leads the team in solo stops (29) and is second on the squad with 41 total tackles. He has 3.5 tackles for loss, four pass break-ups and two quarterback hurries.

TLU has played the better part of the last two games without starting cornerbacks Acie Washington and Leonard Durand. Zack Weathersby, a junior transfer, and Brandon McCoy, a senior back from injury, started for TLU in last week's game against Sul Ross State.

TLU SPECIAL TEAMS

The Bulldogs special teams had a shake-up last week with freshman Dillon Koop starting in front of Frank Vera at punter. Koop punted eight times last week against Sul Ross State and averaged 35.4 yards per punt. He had a long of 57, one touchback, and one punt downed inside the 20. Vera booted the last punt of the day for TLU last week. The punt traveled 43 yards.

The place-kicking duties are still manned by freshman Allen Cain, who remains perfect on point-after attempts (10-for-10). He is 1-for-2 on the year in field goal attempts. He has a miss from 32 and a make from 36.

TLU averages 9.5 yards per punt return with all but one punt return being recorded by junior Brian Box, who has a long of 30. The Bulldogs return kicks an average of 20.7 yards per return. Anthony Smith and Box have returned the bulk of the kicks, with Smith handling 13 and Box taking 11. Smith has a long kickoff return of 42, and Box has a long return of 40.

UIW SPECIAL TEAMS

Aaron Willis is slated to start at punter for the Cardinals on Saturday. Willis has punted just seven times this year and has an average yards per punt of 39.0. He has a long of 50.

Place-kicking duties go to Thomas Rebold, who has also punted 30 times for the Cardinals in 2009. Rebold is 3-for-5 on field goal attempts. He has connected from 43, 39, and 36 and missed from 43 and 35. Rebold is 14-for-14 on extra-point attempts.

Jacob Love and Trent Rios has combined for 23 kick returns. Love has taken 12 and produced 222 yards. Rios has 12 returns for 259 yards. Love also handles the punt return duties.
