Dennis Parker is in his third year as head coach for the Texas Lutheran Bulldogs. Parker returned to his Texas coaching roots in 2007 after coaching in Mesa, Ariz., at Mesa High School, for three seasons. Parker led TLU to a two-win improvement in 2008. TLU went 4-6 last season after opening with a 2-8 campaign in 2007, Parker's first year with the program. Parker was hired on Jan. 22, 2007 as the 22<sup>nd</sup> coach in school history.

Parker was the head coach at North Texas for the 1991, 1992 and 1993 seasons. Parker was also an assistant coach at Southeast Missouri State University from 1977 to 1981. Parker won a state championship at Marshall High School in Marshall, Texas in 1990. Parker took the job at Marshall after serving as the offensive coordinator for Converse Judson on its 1983 state championship team.

When he took over the Hardin-Simmons program in 1990, Jimmie Keeling had just ended a Hall of Fame High School career. Now, 20 years later he has put together an impressive collegiate resume. The legendary coach has now combined to coach 503 games in his over 50 years as a head coach at the collegiate and high school levels.

Keeling was hired as the head coach to revive Hardin-Simmons' football program after a 37-year absence in 1990. He has put together one of the top Division III programs in the country, and HSU is the winningest collegiate team in Texas since 1990. His teams have posted a record of 162-51 entering Saturday's game with Texas Lutheran.

### Game Overview

Texas Lutheran hits the road to Abilene, Texas for a 2 p.m. kickoff Saturday against Hardin-Simmons University. Seguin radio station KWED 1580 AM will have the radio call, starting at 1:30 p.m. KWED's audio can also be found at [www.seguintoday.com](http://www.seguintoday.com). The KWED audio is paired with the TLU live video webcast at [www.tlu.edu/athletics](http://www.tlu.edu/athletics).

TLU will be out to snap a 10-game losing streak that dates back to the final three games of 2008. The Bulldogs have not tasted victory since Oct. 25, 2008, when TLU won in Abilene with an 18-0 victory over McMurry.

A loss Saturday by TLU would set the new school mark for consecutive losses at 11. The football program has lost 10 games in a row on three different occasions in its history, which dates back to 1912.

TLU had a 13-game winless streak stretching over the 1954, 1955 and 1956 seasons. The Bulldogs had a tie in the 1955 season that kept the team winless but that stopped the consecutive losses streak at 10.

After starting the year 1-4, Hardin-Simmons has rebounded with three consecutive victories. Two of those wins (against East Texas Baptist and against Sul Ross State) have come on the road. Last week HSU went to Alpine, Texas and defeated the Lobos 29-6.

The Cowboys need wins in their final two games (vs. TLU and vs. McMurry) to secure the program's 18<sup>th</sup>-straight winning season. That streak of winning seasons ranks 12<sup>th</sup> in all divisions of NCAA football.

HSU is 10-1 all-time against TLU. The only Bulldog victory over the Cowboys came on Nov. 12, 2005. On that day in Seguin's Matador Stadium, the Bulldogs pulled a 32-27 upset over then-No. 11 ranked HSU.

The Bulldogs have never won at HSU's Shelton Stadium.

## WHEN TLU HAS THE BALL ...

### Texas Lutheran Offense

The Bulldogs have rotated quarterbacks for much of the 2009 season. This Saturday appears to be no different with true freshman Rocky Huff (Houston/Jersey Village) slated to make his second career start. Huff started the season-opener that TLU lost 22-21 to Trinity on a time-expiring field goal.

Huff has thrown two touchdowns and three interceptions in 2009. Last week in a reserve role against McMurry, Huff tossed a 37-yard TD pass to senior Jonathon Randle (Prairie View/Waller).

On the season, Huff has played in five games and completed 44.2 percent of his passes (19-for-43). He has thrown for 174 yards.

TLU quarterbacks on the season have thrown 20 interceptions and 11 touchdowns. The team completion percentage is only 44.5. The Bulldogs' starter at QB for most of the season, Jarret Buchholtz (Luling/Luling/Texas College), has eight TD passes and 13 interceptions.

TLU remains last in the American Southwest Conference in scoring offense (17.1), total offense (245.6 yards per game), interceptions thrown (20), first downs (102), third-down conversions (28.4 percent), and turnover margin (-3.14 per game).

Senior running back Anthony Smith (Bay City/Bay City/Blinn JC) is TLU's second-leading rusher (220 yards) and third-leading receiver (204 yards). Smith is third in the ASC in all-purpose yardage at 131.9 per game. In addition to his rushing and receiving numbers, Smith has 479 kickoff return yards and 20 yards on punt returns.

Steven Thrash (Hubbard/Hubbard) is the top receiving threat for the Bulldogs. Thrash is fourth in the league in receiving yards per game (72.6). He has 36 catches for 508 yards with five touchdowns. Last week against McMurry, Thrash had a team-best six receptions for 65 yards, with a touchdown of 10 yards from Buchholtz.

Senior receiver Jonathon Randle enjoyed his finest receiving day as a Bulldog with last week's 100-yard performance against McMurry. Randle had four catches for an even 100. He had a long reception of 39 and a TD catch of 37 yards (from Huff).

Place-kicker Allen Cain, a true freshman from San Antonio (Stevens), is a perfect 12-for-12 on point-after attempts. Cain has connected on field goals 36 (vs. Howard Payne) and 33 (vs. McMurry). He has missed from 32 (vs. Mary Hardin-Baylor) and 40 (blocked, vs. Incarnate Word).

### Hardin-Simmons Defense

The Texas Lutheran offense will face a Hardin-Simmons defense that ranks as the conference's second-best scoring defense. The Cowboys allow 25.6 points per game. In their last three contests, all HSU victories, the Cowboys have allowed 15.67 points per game. HSU held East Texas Baptist to 10 on the road, allowed 31 at home to Howard Payne, and surrendered just six last week on the road against Sul Ross State.

The Cowboys also rank second in the ASC in total defense, by allowing 356.2 yards of total offense to opponents per game. Opponents have scored 25 touchdowns against the HSU defense and averaged 5.2 yards per play.

The HSU rushing defense (fifth in the ASC) surrenders 3.8 yards per carry and has allowed 11 rushing TDs. The Cowboys' passing defense (fourth in the ASC) allows only 196.5 yards per game. The Cowboys have given up 14 TDs and intercepted six passes.

Individual stand-outs on defense for HSU include: senior middle linebacker Paul Girard, junior defensive end Hank Hornsby, sophomore defensive end Garrison Hardin, junior outside linebacker Roy Gamboa, sophomore outside linebacker Wes Liles, and cornerback L.C. Cisneroz.

Girard leads the team in total tackles, with 62. He also has 6.0 tackles for loss and two sacks. Hornsby has 50 total tackles and is tied for the team lead in tackles for loss (with Hardin) at seven. Hornsby has seven for 31, and Hardin has seven for 34. Hornsby leads HSU in sacks, at 3.5. Hardin and senior Jimmie McAfee each have three sacks.

Outside linebacker Gamboa had three fumble recoveries to go with his 45 total tackles. He scored last week against Sul Ross on a 23-yard fumble recovery for a TD. Fellow outside linebacker Wes Liles has two fumble recoveries, six tackles for loss and two sacks. Of HSU's six pass interceptions in 2009, three have been recorded by cornerback L.C. Cisneroz.

## WHEN HSU HAS THE BALL ...

### Hardin-Simmons Offense

The losses of ASC Preseason Offensive Player of the Year Justin Feaster at quarterback and senior wide receiver ZaVious Robbins to injury have slowed down the Cowboys' attack in 2009. But that doesn't mean the Cowboys are totally devoid of firepower.

Last week against Sul Ross State, HSU scored its first three touchdowns on plays of 77, 64 and 58 yards. Sophomore quarterback Taylor Byrd connected with junior slotback Thomas Labian on TD passes of 77 and 74 and hit senior flanker Justice Baker on a 58-yard score. All three TD passes came in the first half.

Byrd completed just five of his 10 passes last week against Sul Ross State. But three went for scores. He ended the day with 212 yards passing, an average of 42.4 yards per completion and an average of 21.2 yards per attempt.

Byrd (5-8, 190) has played in seven games and thrown for 1,217 yards. He has nine TD passes and seven interceptions. His 77-yard TD strike

last week was his longest completion of the season. Byrd completes 52.7 percent of his passes. He is the only quarterback besides Feaster to throw a pass for HSU this season.

Byrd's top receiving target is Labian, with 26 grabs, five TDs and 435 receiving yards. Baker actually leads the team in receiving yards with 476 but is second on the team in total catches, at 21. Baker averages 22.7 yards per grab and has three TDs receiving. He has a long reception of 68. Seguin native Isaac Camacho is slated to start for HSU at split end.

The running game is fourth in the ASC in yards per game, at 170.0. The Cowboys have scored 11 times on the ground in 2009. Running backs Steven Rockwell and Derrick Grant have combined for 960 yards rushing and three touchdowns. Grant has 103 carries for 537 yards, and Rockwell has 90 carries for 423 yards. Both backs are sophomores.

The offensive line averages 266 pounds in weight and 6-foot-1 in height. Sophomore quick tackle Ross Hutchinson stands 6-4 and weights 245. Junior strong tackle Koby Parker is 6-3 and 290.

### **Texas Lutheran Defense**

The Bulldogs surrender an average of 40.3 points per game. TLU is last in the ASC in scoring defense and second-to-last in rushing defense (195.4 yards per game).

In last week's loss to McMurry, the Bulldogs allowed five TD passes and 264 passing yards. The Bulldogs held McMurry, the league's worst rushing offense, to eight net yards on 18 carries.

Texas Lutheran freshman defensive end Chris Kyle tied the American Southwest Conference single-game record for sacks with four Saturday against McMurry.

Kyle (McAllen/McAllen) had a total of five tackles on Saturday, and all five went for losses (totaling 36 yards). The ASC-record four sacks were four of Kyle's five defensive stops against McMurry. The four sacks alone resulted in 33 yards in losses.

Kyle, who also had two quarterback hurries, achieved the single-game sack mark that only two others had reached in the 14-year history of the league. Hardin-Simmons defensive end Reggie Robinson did it twice, and East Texas Baptist defensive end Chad Glover did it once. Both players tallied their single-game sack marks during the 2004 season.

The four sacks by Kyle also set a new TLU NCAA Division III-era single-game sacks record. TLU's era of NCAA Division III football began in 1998.

Kyle now leads the ASC in sacks with seven for 61 yards in losses. He is second in the league in tackles for loss (with 11.5 for 69 yards in losses).

Frank Vera handles the punting for TLU. The senior from Laredo is fourth in the ASC in punting average, at 38.0. Vera has a long of 53, nine fair catches forced, and nine punts inside the opponent's 20.

### **LAST WEEK FOR TLU McMurry 36, Texas Lutheran 23**

SEGUIN, Texas – McMurry quarterback Jake Mullin tossed five touchdowns (four of them to receiver Marcus Franklin) in a 36-23 American Southwest Conference victory Saturday over Texas Lutheran.

At Seguin's Matador Stadium, Mullin hit Franklin on TD strikes of 12, 20, 37, and 48. The two longest scoring plays between Mullin and Franklin came in the fourth quarter.

TLU closed within a touchdown, at 24-17, on a Quinten Cleveland (Galveston/Ball) 1-yard run. The TD rush capped an 11-play, 63-yard drive that took 5:30 off the clock.

But McMurry responded with scoring strikes that combined took 2:20 off the game clock. The 37-yarder to Franklin put McMurry ahead 30-17



with 12:12 to play, and the 48-yarder gave the visitors a 36-17 edge with 8:50 remaining.

The Bulldogs added a 37-yard TD strike from freshman quarterback Rocky Huff (Houston/Jersey Village) to senior receiver Jonathon Randle (Prairie View/Waller) with 2:20 to play. The ensuing onside kick by TLU went out of bounds, and McMurry ran out the remainder of the clock.

McMurry won for the fourth straight time under first-year head coach Hal Mumme. McMurry remained in third place in the American Southwest Conference with the victory. McMurry now stands at 4-4 overall and at 4-2 in the ASC.

TLU dropped to 0-7 overall and to 0-5 in the ASC. The Bulldogs have dropped 10 consecutive games dating back to the final three games of 2008. This current 10-game losing skid by TLU ties for the longest consecutive-loss streak in Bulldog football history.

Mullin, a sophomore from Burlinson, was 26-for-39 with 264 yards passing against TLU. He did not throw an interception.

TLU quarterbacks Jarret Buchholtz (Luling/Luling/Texas College), Luke Davis (Baytown/Baytown Christian) and Huff were a combined 11-for-29 with five interceptions, two touchdowns, and 178 yards.

TLU quarterbacks were sacked eight times. Ricky Jimenez had two of the eight sacks for McMurry.

McMurry safety Gene Hudson picked off three of the TLU passes. Hudson added six tackles and a half tackle for loss.

McMurry linebacker Andrew Wallace had 11 total tackles, two tackles for loss, an interception and a sack.

TLU freshman defensive end Chris Kyle (McAllen/McAllen) collected a career-best four sacks against McMurry. Kyle had five total tackles, and all five tackles went for losses. Kyle ended the game with five tackles for

36 yards in losses. The four sacks resulted in 33 yards in losses. He also had two quarterback hurries.

Randle led TLU in receiving with the first 100-yard game of his career. He caught four passes for an even 100 yards. He had a long reception of 39 yards.

TLU's Steven Thrash (Hubbard/Hubbard) added six receptions for 65 yards with a 10-yard TD pass from Buchholtz.

**LAST WEEK FOR HSU  
Hardin-Simmons 29, Sul Ross State 6**

ALPINE, Texas — Hardin-Simmons football team evened its record at 4-4 with a 29-6 win at Sul Ross State in American Southwest Conference action Saturday afternoon in Jackson Field.

The Cowboys used the big play to take a 20-0 halftime lead. On the first drive of the game, Taylor Byrd hit Thomas Labian on a screen pass that went 77 yards for a touchdown. The two hooked up again in the second quarter, this time on a perfectly thrown pass over the top for a 64-yard touchdown to make it 13-0.

With 1:18 to play in the half, Byrd found a wide-open Justice Baker for a 58-yard touchdown to make it 20-0 at halftime. Byrd completed four passes in the first half for 208 yards. The Cowboys went to a more conservative attack in the second half and Byrd finished the game 5-for-10 for 222 yards and three touchdowns.

HSU's defense stymied the Sul Ross State offense for most of the game. The Lobos ran for 282 yards on 60 carries and had 28 yards passing. HSU stopped the Lobos twice on downs in the red zone. Wes Liles led the defense with 12 tackles, Paul Girard had 11 and Cooper Haralson had 10, Defensive linemen James Morgan-Hadnot, Garrison Hardin and Hank Hornsby controlled the line of scrimmage most of the game.

HSU drove the ball down into the red zone on its first drive in the second half and Alex Wymore hit a 31-yard field goal to make it 23-0 with 8:26 to play in the third quarter. Sul Ross State came back and had their only score of the game when they went 67 yards in three plays. Alex LoVan scored from four yards out and a 2-point conversion was no good for Sul Ross State.

The last score of the game came from the Cowboy defense when Roy Gamboa scooped a fumble and returned it 23 yards for a touchdown to make it 29-6 and Wymore missed the PAT.

**Last Meeting between Texas Lutheran and Hardin-Simmons  
Hardin-Simmons 52, Texas Lutheran 6  
(Nov. 1, 2008 in Seguin, Texas)**

SEGUIN, Texas – Justin Feaster and the Hardin-Simmons Cowboys spoiled Texas Lutheran's Homecoming football game with a 52-6 defeat of the Bulldogs Saturday at Seguin's Matador Stadium.

Hardin-Simmons moved to 8-1 overall and to 6-1 in the American Southwest Conference.

TLU dropped to 4-4 overall and to 3-3 in the ASC with its first defeat in four games.

Feaster, the Cowboys' signal caller, threw five touchdowns and completed 19-of-23 passes for 276 yards. Feaster's primary target, Mychal Carrillo, caught seven passes for 114 and had two touchdowns.

Hardin-Simmons, ranked 12th in the latest D3football.com poll, opened a 31-6 lead at the half.

TLU managed two first-half field goals from Josh Spaw, but TLU was shutout in the second half.

The Bulldogs turned the ball over six times (five interceptions and a fumble). One fumble for TLU took place at the HSU 1-yard line.

TLU had the ball nearly twice as long as Hardin-Simmons, but the Cowboys often took TLU turnovers and turned the short fields into quick points. The Cowboys had scoring drives of one play, one play, two plays, and four plays.

The Bulldogs recorded eight tackles for loss, resulting in 43 yards in losses. The Bulldogs also picked up five sacks (for 40 yards), recovered two fumbles, tallied 84 interception return yards and broke up four passes.
