Game Overview

The Bulldogs and Crusaders open American Southwest Conference play this Saturday with a 6 p.m. game at Belton High School’s Tiger Stadium. UMHB enters the contest as the No. 3-ranked team in NCAA Division III according to D3football.com. UMHB was a national semi-finalist a year ago.

The game with UMHB will be the Bulldogs’ second straight contest against a Top 25 program. TLU’s last win over a Top 25 program came on Sept. 9, 2006 when the Bulldogs defeated Trinity 14-9. TLU’s last win over a nationally-ranked ASC opponent came on Nov. 12, 2005 when the Bulldogs defeated No. 11 Hardin-Simmons 32-27 in Seguin.

UMHB is the preseason favorite to win the ASC. UMHB has won at least a share of the ASC title in five of the last six seasons, going 48-3 over that time frame in conference games. UMHB also holds a 21-game winning streak against league opponents.

UMHB holds a 9-1 edge in the all-time series with Texas Lutheran. The Bulldogs lone win in the series came in 1999, when TLU won in Seguin 34-24. UMHB has out-scored TLU 321 to 143 over the first 10 meetings.

UMHB is in its 11th season of football after starting the program in 1998. TLU is in its 11th season of non-scholarship football after reviving the program in 1998. The Bulldogs did not field a football team from 1988 to 1997.

The Crusaders are 88-27 since starting football in 1998. UMHB was the national runner-up in 2004 (losing to Linfield (Ore.) in the national title game) and fell to eventual national champion University of Wisconsin-Whitewater in the 2007 national semi-final.

TLU is 38-64 (counting this year’s 1-1 start) since re-starting football in 1998. The Bulldogs are 32-52 in American Southwest Conference games. The Bulldogs highest finish in the conference came in 2004, when TLU finished third and played for a share of the ASC title in the final weekend of the regular season.

Ike Shuts Down Home Game; Trinity Shuts Down TLU

Hurricane Ike forced last week’s TLU-Trinity game to be moved to Thursday, Sept. 11 instead of the originally-scheduled Saturday, Sept. 13. The game was also moved from Seguin’s Matador Stadium to Trinity’s home field, E.M. Stevens Stadium. The Thursday game was TLU’s first non-Saturday game of the school’s NCAA DIII-era, which began in 1998. The change of locale and change in date did TLU little favors in the Bulldogs’ 24-0 loss to Trinity.

The 22nd-ranked Tigers put all 24 points on the scoreboard in the first half. Trinity (2-0) received two first-half TD passes and a scoring run from senior QB Bryant Wilson. Peter Licalzi’s 19-yard field goal accounted for the other three Trinity points. Wilson hit Shawn Thompson on a 69-yard TD strike at the 3:46 mark of the first quarter to make the score 14-0 Trinity. Chris Baer scored on a 10-yard pass from Wilson at the 4:41 mark of the second quarter.

TLU managed just 83 yards of total offense in the first half compared to 247 for the Tigers. TLU finished the game with 189 yards of total offense. The Tigers amassed 386 yards of total offense and gained 201 yards on the ground. Baer rushed 17 times for 116 yards, and Al Furlow added six carries for 46.

TLU’s Anthony Smith collected 45 rushing yards on 16 carries, and junior quarterback Dustin Burleson added 37 yards on the ground. TLU quarterbacks Burleson and Joel Waldon were a combined 9-for-20 with two interceptions. The Bulldogs missed field goals of 27 and 38 yards.



About Texas Lutheran's Dennis Parker ...

On Jan. 22, 2007, Dennis Parker returned to his Texas coaching roots as the new head football coach at Texas Lutheran University. Parker was named TLU's 19th football coach. Coach Parker coached the Bulldogs to a 2-8 season in 2007 with a 2-6 mark in the American Southwest Conference.

Parker's overall collegiate coaching mark currently stands at 14-30-1 counting his three full season at North Texas (11-21-1) and his 11 games at TLU.

Parker coached Mesa High School in Mesa, Ariz., for the three seasons prior to coming to TLU. Parker coached Mesa to a 3-7 record in 2004, a 5-5 mark in 2005 and a 7-4 record in 2006. Parker guided the Jackrabbits to the state playoffs in 2006. For Mesa, the playoff appearance was its first since 2000.

Parker has collegiate coaching experience as the head coach of NCAA Division I University of North Texas. He coached at North Texas for the 1991, 1992 and 1993 seasons. Parker was also an assistant coach at Southeast Missouri State University from 1977 to 1981.

Parker won a state championship at Marshall High School in Marshall, Texas in 1990. Parker took the job at Marshall after serving as the offensive coordinator for Converse Judson on its 1983 state championship team.

Parker has had football head coaching stops in Texas at San Antonio Edison High School, Marshall High School and Cleburne High School. He has been a Texas high school assistant football coach at San Antonio Edison, San Antonio Holmes and Converse Judson. He was named the Texas High School Coach of the Year in 1988 and in 1990.

About UMHB's Pete Fredenburg ...

Coach Fredenburg began his career in Texas as a coach at several high schools including Canyon High School, New Braunfels High School, and Giddings High School. He has coached more than 20 players who have played professional football.

After starting the UMHB football program in 1998, it took Fredenburg just four seasons to take the Crusaders to the NCAA Division III playoffs and just five years for him to guide UMHB to an American Southwest Conference championship. In only the seventh season of UMHB football, Fredenburg had the Crusaders in the NCAA Division III National Championship game.

Fredenburg and the Crusaders advanced to the NCAA Division III national semi-finals in 2007, losing 16-7 to Wisconsin-Whitewater on the road. Whitewater defeated Mount Union for the national title a week later.

The Crusaders were ASC Champions in 2007, 2006, 2005, and ASC Tri-Champions in 2003 after winning their first ASC Championship in 2002. The Crusaders also finished the 2004 season ranked second in the nation in all three of the major Division III National Polls.

The Crusaders have also earned six trips to the NCAA Division III Football Championships under Coach Fredenburg, claiming berths in 2001, 2002, 2004, 2005, 2006, and 2007.

Coach Fredenburg had a 13-year tenure at Baylor University as Defensive Coordinator and assistant head coach. After the job at Baylor, he then moved to Louisiana State University. After one year at LSU, he was given the opportunity to be the Defensive Coordinator at Louisiana Tech University. He remained there for three years.

Bulldogs picked sixth in ASC Preseason Poll; UMHB the Preseason Favorite

The Texas Lutheran Bulldogs were picked sixth in the 2008 American Southwest Conference Preseason Football Poll, released after a vote by the league's head coaches, sports information directors and selected media members.

The Bulldogs, coming off a 2007 campaign that produced a 2-8 overall record and a 2-6 ASC mark, were picked behind ASC favorite Mary Hardin-Baylor and conference members Hardin-Simmons, Mississippi College, East Texas Baptist and Louisiana College. TLU placed ahead of Howard Payne, Sul Ross State and McMurry in the poll.

The University of Mary Hardin-Baylor was picked to win its fourth straight ASC football title. Earning preseason player of the year honors were Mississippi College's Adam Shaffer, UMHB's Eric Henri and East Texas Baptist University's Kyle Pope.

Mary Hardin-Baylor, which went 12-2 overall (8-0 in ASC) and reached the national semifinals of the NCAA Division III playoffs last season, totaled 240 points – the highest amount in the annual poll's history – and collected 24 of the possible 27 first-place votes.

Burleson, Waldon split time at QB v. Trinity

Junior transfer Dustin Burleson and fifth-year senior Joel Waldon each saw time at quarterback during last Thursday's loss to Trinity. Waldon saw the majority of the time in the first half, but Burleson saw the bulk of the time in the second half as TLU went to a run-dominant attack.

Both QBs saw time in the season-opener against Sul Ross State, with Burleson getting a small look in the first half. Waldon played the entire second half against Sul Ross and led TLU to a comeback victory with two fourth-quarter drives, of 80 and 81 yards.

Waldon is scheduled to make his fifth collegiate start on Saturday against Mary Hardin-Baylor. Burleson is listed as the back-up on the depth chart.

Waldon missed nearly all of 2007 with a season-ending knee injury suffered in the season-opener. Waldon is 2-2 as TLU's starting quarterback.

Offense Misfires in Game No. 2

Against Trinity last week, the Bulldogs were shutout for the second time in nine games (dating back to last season's 48-0 shutout at the hands of Mary Hardin-Baylor).

TLU collected just 189 yards of total offense (96 on the ground and 93 through the air). The Bulldogs completed nine passes and tossed two interceptions. TLU did convert 7-of-15 third-down opportunities, but the team went 0-for-2 in the red zone. The Bulldogs tossed a goal-line interception and missed field goals of 27 and 38 yards.

Joel Waldon completed seven of the Bulldogs' nine passes and collected 47 yards passing. He had a long pass of 19. Dustin Burleson completed just two of his seven pass attempts and had 46 yards passing. He had a completion of 38 yards to Steven Thrash.

Burleson also ran for 37 yards on 10 carries. Anthony Smith led TLU with 45 yards on 16 carries.

McAdams tops tackle chart after two games

TLU sophomore linebacker Jarrad McAdams is TLU's leading tackler after two games. McAdams has 17 total stops (seven solo, 10 assists) with a tackle for loss and a fumble recovery. He currently ranks seventh in the ASC in total tackles per game.

McAdams and freshman safety Rolton Stevens each had nine tackles in Thursday's loss to Trinity.

Bonner adds to career interception total

TLU senior Dwight Bonner collected his 13th career interception with a pick in last week's game at Trinity. Bonner stepped in front of a Bryant Wilson pass in the first half and returned the interception 12 yards. Bonner also had a pass break-up and six total tackles (2 solo, 4 assists) against the Tigers.

Bonner has intercepted at least three passes a year since his freshman year of 2005. Bonner interception three in 2005, six in 2006, and three in 2007. He has 181 yards in interception return yardage, and he has one career interception return for a touchdown, which came in the 2005 road game at Sul Ross State.

Bonner is second on the TLU DIII-era list for career interceptions. David Garcia, who played for the Bulldogs from 2002-04 and in 2006, interception 16 passes in his four-year career. Garcia led the nation in INTs, with nine, in 2004.

On the all-time TLU career interceptions list, Bonner's 13 picks ranks fourth among all Bulldogs. TLU Hall of Famer Carl Schoessow holds the TLU career mark with 22. Garcia is second, with 16, and TLU Hall of Famer Kevin Ott is third, with 15.

Vera continues to boom the punts

TLU junior punter Frank Vera enjoyed another solid outing last week in the punting department. Against Trinity, Vera punted five times for 38.8 yards with a long of 54. He placed one punt inside the Trinity 20.

For the season, Vera has punted 10 times for 436 yards, an average of 43.6 yards per punt. He has the conference's longest punt to date, a 66-yard booted against Sul Ross State in Week 1. The 66-yarder was also Vera's career-best punt.

For his career, Vera has punted 66 times for 2,487 yards, an average of 37.7 per kick. He has placed 20 punts inside the 20 and has 11 career punts of more than 50 yards.

Vera is in his second year as TLU's punter.

Smith leading ASC in All-Purpose again

TLU junior Anthony Smith is leading the American Southwest Conference in all-purpose yardage per game, with an average of 136.0 yards per game. Smith has rushed for 168 yards on 38 carries (4.4 average) and has three receptions for six yards, two punt returns for 22 yards, and four kick returns for 76 yards.

Smith is currently third in the ASC in total yards rushing (168) and fourth in the league in rushing yards per game (84.0). Smith is averaging 4.4 yards per carry. He has a long rush of 28 yards this season.

Walker, Villarreal bringing the pass rush

TLU senior defensive end James Villarreal and junior defensive tackle Eric Walker are tied for second in the ASC in tackles for loss per game. Each player has three tackles for loss through the first two games.

Walker has three regular tackles for loss, and Villarreal has two regular tackles for loss and one sack.

Last Meeting

Sept. 22, 2007, in Seguin, Texas (UMHB 48, TLU 0)

Second-ranked Mary Hardin-Baylor rolled up 306 yards rushing and received 209 yards and three touchdowns from running back Jarvis Thrasher in a 48-0 rout of Texas Lutheran, Saturday afternoon at Seguin's Matador Stadium.

UMHB improved to 3-0 overall and to 2-0 in the American Southwest Conference. Texas Lutheran fell to 0-4 overall and to 0-2 in the ASC.

Thrasher scored on runs of 72 and 74 yards in the second quarter as the Crusaders opened a 24-0 lead at the half. Thrasher added a 1-yard TD run in the third quarter to give UMHB a 31-0 lead.

UMHB opened the game's scoring with a 17-yard TD pass from Josh Welch to Patrick Oliver. The Crusaders also collected two Joel Munoz field goals, of 38 and 34 yards, and a TD pass from Welch to Brian Scott.

UMHB ended the scoring with a 2-yard run by Peyton Price.

TLU was shut-out for the first time in 37 games. The Bulldogs managed just 183 yards of total offense on 71 plays. TLU rushed 37 times for 34 yards.

UMHB had 503 yards of total offense and was 8-for-17 on third down.

TLU sophomore Andrew Stewart, making his first collegiate start at quarterback, completed 15 of 34 passes for 149 yards. He threw two interceptions.

Anthony Smith, TLU's sophomore running back, rushed 14 times for 45 yards and caught eight passes for 88 yards. Smith had a long rush of 21 and a long reception of 30. He also returned four kicks for 52 yards, with a long of 22.

TLU punted 10 times in the game and was stopped on downs on two occasions. The Bulldogs were 2-for-17 on third downs.

Crusaders Open 2008 with Home Victory

The University of Mary Hardin-Baylor football team rode the arm of Kyle Noack and the legs of Quincy Daniels to a 30-7 victory over Southern Nazarene University in the Cru's season opener Friday night in Belton. UMHB, ranked 4th in the country in Division III, moved to 1-0 on the season with the win. The Crimson Storm, ranked 22nd nationally in NAIA, dropped to 2-1 on the year with the loss.

The Cru took the game's opening possession 69 yards in seven plays, capped by a 20-yard Daniels touchdown run. SNU snapped the ball out of the end zone for a safety to give the Cru a 9-0 lead. Daniels added a one-yard TD plunge with 3:39 remaining in the first quarter to give UMHB a 16-0 edge.

Noack hit Brian Scott with a 41-yard touchdown strike to close out an eight-play, 81-yard drive in the second quarter to give the Cru a 23-0 lead at halftime. Noack added a 15-yard touchdown run with 2:45 left in the third quarter to put UMHB on top 30-0. Jared Elmore caught a 15-yard TD pass from Larry Dockery with 14:03 left in the game to provide the final margin and give the Crimson Storm its only points of the game.

Noack finished the night 16-23 passing for 196 yards and a TD. He fell just four yards short of becoming just the third quarterback in UMHB history to throw for 200 or more yards in a game. Noack added 13 yards rushing and a TD on the ground.

Daniels ran for 100 yards and a pair of scores on 21 carries. He reached the 100-yard mark for the eighth time in his career to move into fourth place on the UMHB career list for 100-yard games.

Roger Sanchez added 53 rushing yards for the Cru and Tariekus Ellis caught five passes for 37 yards in his first collegiate game for UMHB. Jeremy Salinas led the Cru defense with nine tackles and Bryson Tucker added eight more for UMHB. A total of 24 different players recorded a tackle in the game for the Cru.

Dockery was 19-37 passing for SNU for 182 yards and the TD. Elmore caught eight passes for 117 yards and Branden Smith ran for 55 yards on 12 carries for the Crimson Storm.

UMHB rolled up 401 yards of total offense in a balanced offensive attack. The Cru ran for 205 yards and threw for 196. The UMHB defense held the Crimson Storm to 37 rushing yards and 219 yards of total offense. The two teams combined for 23 penalties for 208 yards in the game.
