

Memory of Linda Clark honored with service

A memorial service for Linda Clark was held March 26 at the Chapel of the Abiding Presence. Family, friends, faculty, staff and students joined one another as a community to remember the life of Clark, who was a part of the TLU family for almost 18 years. Clark, at age 65, died suddenly on March 23, in a highway car accident near Seguin.

She served as technical services librarian, academic advisor and classroom teacher in the honors and global studies programs.

At the service, President Svenningsen, pastor Greg Ronning, colleague Martha Rimm, and survived husband Donald Clark, spoke of their personal experiences with Clark. Clark is remembered as a caring woman of faith, with interests in nature, trav-

eling and mystery novels.

"Professor Linda Clark was my F.E. teacher and advisor. She was a very sweet person; always greeting you with a smile and willing to listen to anything you would tell her." Veronica Gentile, freshman undecided major, said. "She had a very good sense of humor and was sincere in her attempts to expand our knowledge. The library will not be the same knowing that she is not in her office and not seeing her moseying around."

In memory of Clark, the Blumberg Memorial library staff has created the Linda Clark Memorial Book Fund which will purchase books for the library in memory of her.
