# TLU SEX AND GENDER DISCRIMINATION AND TITLE IX SEXUAL HARASSMENT RESOURCES

What is Sex and Gender Discrimination? Sex and gender discrimination includes any adverse action which denies an individual access to either education or employment at Texas Lutheran University based on sex, gender, sexual orientation, or gender identity. It includes, but is not limited to, behaviors such as sexual harassment, sexual assault, dating violence, domestic violence, stalking, and sexual exploitation.

What is Title IX Sexual Harassment? Title IX is the federal law that prohibits sex and gender discrimination in every education program that receives federal funding. In May 2020, the U.S. Department of Education revised the prohibited actions that are prohibited specifically by Title IX. Title IX sexual harassment includes two types of sexual harassment, sexual assault, dating violence, domestic violence, and stalking if, and only if, 1) both parties were participating (or attempting to participate) in the education program or activity of the school; 2) the allegation occurred within the United States; and 3) occurred either on-campus or off-campus when the University exercised substantial control over the parties and context in which the alleged action took place. If an alleged action does not fall under Title IX sexual harassment, it may be investigated under the University's sex and gender discrimination policies and procedures.

**University Commitment:** Texas Lutheran University is committed to provide an environment that is free from discrimination and misconduct based on sex/gender, including discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation, gender identity, or gender expression. If reported, the University will conduct a prompt, fair, and impartial investigation and, where appropriate, issue corrective measures, and/or sanctions.

## **EMERGENCY RESOURCES**

If you have been physically assaulted, it is helpful to report as soon as you are able, and to preserve any evidence, in case you wish to pursue a criminal, civil, or university investigation. Evidence can include physical evidence through a forensic medical exam, clothing, pictures, texts, and social media communications.

#### LAW ENFORCEMENT

**University Police Department (UPD):** Individuals may report an incident, with or without filing charges. Call 911 for emergencies. For non-emergencies, dial '0' on any TLU phone or 830-372-8000.

**Seguin Police Department (SPD):** If the incident is occurring (occurred) in Seguin, but off-campus, a report may be filed with SPD. Call 911 for emergencies. For non-emergencies, dial 830-379-2123.

#### MEDICAL ATTENTION
